Section 3 of the Ecological Resource Review mentions that this tract contains rock outcrops. This was not originally addressed in the management guide. These outcrops are generally much too steep to harvest trees. In the event that a marked tree was to fall into one of these areas from a more accessible location, the log should be removing through cabling, preventing excessive soil damage.

Two regeneration openings of .6 acre each were marked in the mixed hardwoods forest type. One is located in the center of the tract and the other is located near the western end of the tract. Both openings contain primarily mature and damaged yellow-poplar, American beech, sugar maple, basswood, and ash. The western opening contains a mature prime white oak with a high-risk fork in the crown.
