\*This fund contains revenue from the sale of lifetime fishing, hunting and trapping licenses, which the DNR stopped selling in 2005. The Game Bird Habitat Stamp includes revenue from the sale of Game Bird Habitat Stamps, which is required to hunt game birds in Indiana.

\*\*This program is administered by the USFWS. Funds come from excise taxes paid to the federal government, by manufacturers of sporting arms and ammunition, fishing equipment and motor boat fuel. These user-based funds are returned to Indiana according to a formula based on licensed hunters and anglers, then used to manage fish and wildlife resources. By buying a hunting or fishing license in Indiana, you contribute to fish and wildlife conservation.
