

Location and Access

Parking and trail. In Fort Harrison State Park. From I-465, take 56th St exit (Exit 40) and head east on 56th St until you reach Post Rd (about 2 miles). At Post Rd, turn left (North) and go 0.5 mile until you reach the state park entrance. Follow park's signs to Lawrence Creek or Walnut trailhead parking areas. Both trails go through the preserve; Walnut is a multi-use trail, and Lawrence Creek is a hiking trail.





Description:

This preserve contains heavily dissected slopes and ravine forests along the botanically-rich Lawrence Creek drainage, with a small area of till plain flatwoods. The site is utilized as nesting habitat for a suite of migrant birds, including Hooded Warbler, Brown Creeper, Wood Thrush, Ovenbird, Acadian Flycatcher, and Kentucky Warbler. Warbler Woods Nature Preserve is also within the State Park and included on this map.
