

Description: This area contains a number of plant communities including: upland oak-hickory, mixed mesophytic, and lowland swamp forest; old fields in various successional stages; and pine plantations. Unusual plants include tamarack, yellow birch, and 2 species of shinleaf. Star-nosed moles, Blanding's turtles and massasauga rattlesnakes are among the more unusual animals. The topography is the strongly rolling kettle and kame glacial topography that is so well developed in Steuben County.
