The National Park Service in partnership with Operation Live Well would like to thank military personnel and their families for their service and invite them to enjoy their national parks. Connected Care Pilot Program

Funding for nonprofit and public healthcare providers to cover 85% of the eligible costs of broadband connectivity, certain network equipment, and information services necessary to provide connected care services to a patient population.

CORE Concepts in Telehealth Certificate Program

Self-paced online training program for healthcare students and professionals covering CORE (Clinical, Operational, Regulatory, and Ethics) concepts for successful implementation and delivery of telehealth. Organized in 7 modules, featuring case studies and interactive content on telehealth technology, telepresence skills, licensing, and regulation.

Statewide Family Network

SAMHSA is accepting applications for the Statewide Family Network grant program (SFN). The purpose of this program is to respond more effectively to the needs of children, youth, and young adults with serious emotional disturbances (SED) and their families by providing information, referrals, and support; and to create a mechanism for families to participate in state and local mental health services planning and policy development.

SAMHSA plans to issue 10 awards of up to \$95,000 per year for up to 3 years.

Application Due Date: Monday, January 4, 2021

Nursing Workforce Diversity Program

Funding to assist students from disadvantaged backgrounds in becoming registered nurses using evidence-based strategies to support nursing students from enrollment through graduation. The purpose is to expand and support a workforce to provide quality, culturally-aligned care to rural and underserved communities in need.

Rapid Response Rural Data Analysis and Issue Specific Rural Research Studies

Funding for one entity to assist rural communities with conducting rapid data analyses and short term issue-specific rural research studies to understand the impact of current and proposed policies and regulations and provide information that will improve healthcare in rural America.

Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority Grant

ESG-CV Rapid Rehousing, Shelter, and Outreach (RSO) Application

IHCDA is accepting applications from organizations for rapid rehousing, shelter operations, and/or street outreach (RSO) efforts due to an increased need for services due to the COVID-19 pandemic. These special ESG-CV funds are to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19) among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance; and to support additional homeless assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19. For example:

Rapid re-housing funds can be used to assist individuals affected by COVID-19 by providing short-term rental assistance and services that assist them in obtaining housing quickly, increasing self-sufficiency, and staying housed.

Shelter Operations funds can be used to support emergency shelters that are experiencing increased demand for their services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Street Outreach funds can be used to engage unsheltered people to connect individuals with emergency services and other services to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

- January 29, 2020, at 5:00 PM ET
- February 26, 2020, at 5:00 PM ET
- March 26, 2020, at 5:00 PM ET
