Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana's unemployment rate has decreased 7.0 percentage points since July 2009 (the low point of employment), which ranks 10th in the U.S.
- Total private employment reached a preliminary record highpoint of 2,750,400, which is 18,300 above the official December 2018 peak.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for 57 months in a row. Indiana's rate is currently 65.3% vs. 63.0% for national.
- Indiana Private Sector jobs have grown 38,100 over theyear.
