Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana's unemployment rate has decreased 7.4 percentage points since July 2009 (the low point of employment), which ranks 9th in the U.S.
- Indiana's labor force has decreased by 7,630 over the year and is at 3,383,852.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for 63 months in a row. Indiana's rate is currently 64.4% vs. 63.3% for national.
- Indiana Private Sector jobs have grown 16,500 over the year.
