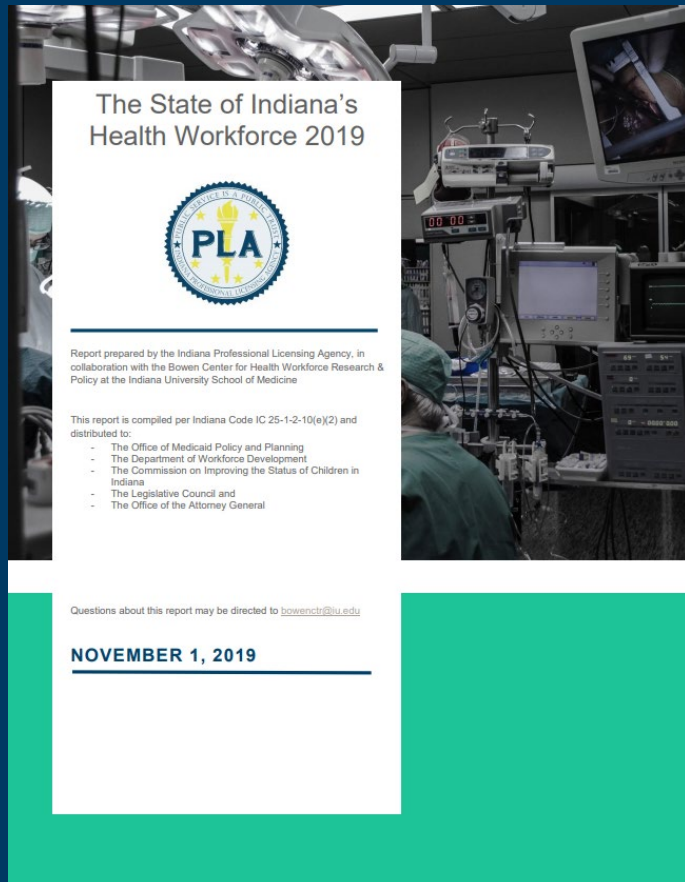

# STATE OF INDIANA'S HEALTH WORKFORCE ANNUAL REPORT



- What's in current report?
  - License counts of all health professions that fall under PLA
  - "Shell" tables of future iterations of report
- What's to come?
  - Full detail on licensed health workforce
    - License Counts
    - Demographics
    - Education
    - Practice characteristics (specialty, FTE, practice location, tele-practice, etc.)
- Keep in mind. . .
  - Only select occupations/licenses fall under the SEA 223-2018 requirement
  - Licenses at PLA are biennial (renewed every 2 years during a specific window) – this impacts when and how data are collected
  - Does not include other health occupations that fall under other executive agencies (ex: CNA, Navigators, etc.)

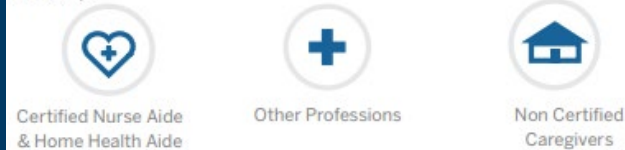
### HOW WE ORGANIZED THE DATA?

This report is organized by the types of services that must be provided by LTC facilities, as outlined by state and federal statute 2.3 (additional information about these requirements can be found in Appendix A). This report includes information from survey data obtained from professions regulated by the professional licensing agency. The services which require licensed health occupations for delivery include:



### WHO IS NOT INCLUDED IN THIS REPORT?

This report examines those licensed professions regulated by the Professional Licensing Agency whose practice/employment is dedicated to geriatric populations or those in long-term/home health care. Certified nurse aides and home health aides are significant contributors to the LTCA workforce. However, they are regulated by a separate entity, Indiana State Department of Health, and therefore, information on these workforces is unavailable. Also, many other professionals provide health care services for geriatric populations without it being their primary focus area (ex: family medicine).
