#### Honor a Veteran! Honor a Woman Veteran!

Today, we commemorate Veterans Day. Take the time to honor veterans, especially women veterans, for their patriotism, love of country and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good. Women have been giving military service to the U.S. since its beginning. The first known woman to receive a pension for her service in the military was Margaret Corbin, who fought with her husband at Fort Washington during the Revolutionary War. In 1779, Congress voted to give her a disability pension of one half a soldier's pay and one suit of clothes or the equivalent in cash.

The role of women in the military has changed throughout history. Prior to 1973, women made up approximately 2% of military forces. In 2008, 14% of service members were women and about 80% of all services' career positions are open to women. Of the approximately 23 million veterans in the U.S., approximately 1.8 million are women.

In Indiana, there are currently 2,373 Hoosier women serving in the various branches of active service. There are 1,032 female military retirees among the over 33,000 women veterans in Indiana. Hoosier women veterans can join the Hoosier Women Veterans Registry through the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs. Its purpose is to serve as an informational bridge to connect women veterans to the numerous resources and benefits that are available to women.
