## MIAMI CORRECTIONAL FACILITY OFFENDER CORRESPONDENCE IN-COMING MAIL **RULES AND REGULATIONS** MAY 2018

To minimize delivery delays, grievances, extra expense to offenders, etc., it is the offender's responsibility to inform all mailers of correspondence limitations. Mailers should never assume that their gift to an offender will be authorized regardless of source, content, or intention.

Incoming mail from family and friends is opened and inspected for items of property that are not allowed. Such property will be confiscated and held for a limited time while the offender decides how to dispose of it. The disposition will be at the offender's expense. Confiscations will not be gate-released. The extra steps involved in processing confiscations can slow down processing of the other mail.

Controlled substances

Laminated items

Hardback books

Clothing of any kind

Pen-Pal solicitation

3rd party letters

Polaroid photographs

Maps, transportation schedules, route diagrams

Pen, pencils, blank paper, "school supplies" Address labels, self-addressed envelopes

Life-sized depictions of weapons (guns, knives, etc)

ID cards, birth certificates, Social Security Cards, etc

Any hygiene items-soap, toothpaste, shampoo, etc.

Clippings from newspapers, magazines, publications

Coloring pages, any types of arts/crafts/drawings on letters/envelope

Offenders are not allowed the following items: (This list is not intended to be all inclusive.)

Any kind of Currency, Money Orders, Personal Checks

Anything that could be made into a weapon

Any kind of binders, notebooks, etc.

Photos/depictions containing nudity/sexually explicit in nature

Locks of hair, body fluids.

Undergarments, jewelry, sunglasses Any item available on commissary

Postage stamps, stamped envelopes

Tattoo paraphernalia

Arts & Craft projects, materials, supplies Foods, snacks, drinks, candy etc of any kind

Post cards/greeting cards

Any electronic or mechanical appliance or device Watches, clocks, batteries, battery chargers

"Inked out" photos (items marked out with pen/marker)

Certificates/Copies of Certificates

Correspondence with white-out will not be permitted Oversize calendars (larger than 12 x 14 when open or fully extended)

Photographs of offenders other than immediate family. All adults and children must be appropriately clothed. Only 25 photos per

day allowed. Photos must be on photography paper (i.e. like those developed at Walmart, CVS, etc.)

Games of any kind, electronic, hand held video games. Boxed games, game pieces, replacement pieces for authorized games

Any item that either is or could be interpreted as having Security Threat Group or gang significance.

Books, magazines, religious publications, etc. that do not comply with the "Publishers' Only" rule. No duplicate copies of publications will be allowed.

Offender to Offender correspondence must be approved through both facilities. RHU Offenders will be denied this privilege.

Lipstick, perfume/scented, or any wet/dried liquid substance-these items will be confiscated and destroyed (per safety/security concerns) Any outgoing offender mail returned to the facility from the post office (for any reason other than postage due) will not be returned to the offender and shall be destroyed.

Incoming Correspondence/packages/Legal Mail with no DOC# will be returned to the sender. Letters with no return address will be returned to the Post Office.

Letters must match the mailer's address or they will be considered 3rd party letters

Personal correspondence must be on white-lined notebook paper and in white envelopes. Personal correspondence in colored envelopes will be returned to the sender. Letters on copy paper will be confiscated or returned to the sender.

Legal documents must come from an attorney/court or must be printed on white-lined notebook paper.

Educational correspondence courses must be approved by Deputy Warden of Re-Entry prior to receiving any coursework.
