

Supervised Release System (SRS)

Indiana Supreme Court | Trial Court Technology in partnership with the Indiana Department of Correction



Highlights

SRS is a new case management solution, designed and developed by Trial Court Technology (TCT) within the INcite framework. SRS was designed for community corrections agencies, probation, court alcohol & drug programs, problem-solving courts, and pretrial service agencies.

SRS is web-based and connects to the Risk Assessment System, Presentence Investigation Reports, Abstract of Judgment, and other INcite applications.

SRS interfaces with the statewide Odyssey court case management system and displays the court's chronological case summary (CCS), hearing information, warrants, and scanned documents.

SRS has a scheduling feature to track community service work for agencies that run their own community service program.

It also includes a Work Release feature for community corrections agencies to manage individuals in their work release facility including: recurring job schedules, one-time passes to leave the facility, and checking-in/checking-out individuals.

The most recent addition to SRS is its financial component, which allows agencies to receipt in payments and manage the accounting of all finances collected.

Background

SRS was designed to generate Department of Correction (DOC) quarterly community corrections reports. It also tracks the reporting requirements for funding received under the HEA 1006 grant process.

SRS collects the necessary data points for probation quarterly reporting, the annual reports for home detention statistics, problem-solving court performance measures, court alcohol & drug program data and the pretrial release pilot project.

Two Deployment Tracks

- 1. SRS will be deployed to all 77 community corrections agencies by December 31, 2020.
 - A Deployment Coordinator and 6 full-time deployment staff will facilitate these efforts.
 - Pilots began in April 2018 with Vigo, Greene, Grant, and Wayne counties.
 - Beginning July 2018, three separate deployment teams will implement SRS to one new agency per month.
- 2. SRS will be offered to probation, problemsolving courts, pretrial agencies and court alcohol & drug programs in new Odyssey counties.

Eventually, the deployment teams will convert the 72 agencies currently using Odyssey Supervision to SRS.
