**AFFECTED PRODUCT:** Deep Coriander Powder

**SUMMARY:** Unclassified Recall; The recall has been initiated because the product has the potential to be contaminated with Salmonella.

The Deep Coriander Powder", Lot# LE15152 comes in a 14.1oz clear plastic jar marked with the UPC number on the rear of the package. The lot number can be located on the bottom of the jar.

-- UPC number for 14.1oz. is 011433134347

The recalled product was distributed nationwide in retail stores from July 30, 2015 to August 13, 2015.

**SUGGESTED ACTION:** Recommend notification of affected parties via phone, fax, or e-mail. Consumers who have purchased 14.1oz jars of "Deep Coriander Powder" are urged to return them to the place of purchase for a full refund. **FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE** – August 20, 2015 – Edison, NJ – Chetak New York L.L.C. of Edison, NJ is recalling 300 jars of 14.1 oz "Deep Coriander Powder", Lot# LE15152, because they have the potential to be contaminated with *Salmonella*, an organism which can cause serious and sometimes fatal infections in young children, frail or elderly people, and others with weakened immune systems. Healthy persons infected with *Salmonella* often experience fever, diarrhea (which may be bloody), nausea, vomiting and abdominal pain. In rare circumstances, infection with *Salmonella* can result in the organism getting into the bloodstream and producing more severe illnesses such as arterial infections (i.e. infected aneurysms), endocarditis and arthritis.

The recalled "Deep Coriander Powder" jars were distributed nationwide in retail store from July 30, 2015 to August 13, 2015. The product comes in a 14.1oz clear plastic jar marked with the UPC number on the rear of the package. The lot number can be located on the bottom of the jar.

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No illnesses have been reported to date in connection with this problem.

The potential for contamination was noted after routine testing conducted by the FDA.
