Deaf Education initiatives:

Deaf Education services offered per request include:

- Consultation with directors, teachers, school staff and families
- Case Conference participation
- Educational Audiology consultation and technical assistance
- Educational Interpreter consulting and technical assistance
- In-service training and professional development
- Deaf and Hard of Hearing program review and consultation

The following services are contractual agreements between the Center and the Local Education Agency (LEA):

- **Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing services:** Temporary consultative services using a teletherapy model. Center staff may also recommend alternative contractual services to meet individual student needs.
- Deaf/Hard of Hearing Adult Involvement School-Age Mentor (SAM) services: Direct services provided to students by Deaf or Hard of Hearing adults to increase students' self-awareness, access, develop language, provide communication opportunities and self-advocacy strategies.
- **Listening and Spoken Language Specialist services:** Direct teletherapy services provided to students using a coaching model to help school professionals and families develop skills to teach students based on listening and spoken language strategies.
