Estimated Annual ED Visits	Response
Less than 25,000	PALS, TNCC and ENPC are highly encouraged for RN's as time permits; we have no APN/PA's. Neonatal Resuscitation ERNP - Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course. The RN job description only has ACLS as a requirement, but we do assure that all RN's have the TNCC and also either the ENPC or PALS. Question #2 Board certification in specialty training. Question #5 Physicians and APN are required to have 150 hours of CEU's but not specific to trauma. We will be requiring the ENPC in the near future for RNs. We also recommend the BCEN for RNs. NRP. Our physicians are staffed by an outside source. PALS and TNCC are strongly encouraged, but not required. Our policy is that you can have ENPC or PALS and NRP.
25,000-50,000	BLS; Highly recommend FCCS, TNCC and ENPC after one year of experience. ENPC will substitute for PALS. NIH Stroke Scale.
50,000-100,000	
Greater than 100,000	PALS for our Peds ED, with ENPC as well. ACLS for our Adult ED.
