Unclassified Recall; The products are being recalled because they were not presented at the U.S. point of entry for inspection and without the benefit of full inspection, a possibility of adverse health consequences exists.

The following product is subject to recall:

 3.2 oz jars of "Les Trois Petits Cochons Rillettes De Pork" in French and "The Three Little Pigs Pork Rillettes" in English with BBY 04/2018/101 15:37 656" and "FR29 225 001CE" printed on the gold lid.

The cases contain 12 jars each and bear the French establishment number "29.225.001" and "P L J" " 155" and Enjoy by 04/11/18.

The product was distributed nationwide.

WASHINGTON, JANUARY 21, 2015 – House of Bricks Realty, Inc., a Wilkes-Barre, PA establishment, is recalling approximately 130 pounds of French pork rillette because they were not presented at the U.S. point of entry for inspection, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) announced today. Without the benefit of full inspection, a possibility of adverse health consequences exists.

 3.2 oz jars of "Les Trois Petits Cochons Rillettes De Pork" in French and "The Three Little Pigs Pork Rillettes" in English with BBY 04/2018/101 15:37 656" and "FR29 225 001CE" printed on the gold lid.

The cases contain 12 jars each and bear the French establishment number "29.225.001" and "P L J" "155" and Enjoy by 04/11/18. The product was shipped to distributors for further sale to consumers.

The problem was discovered using the Public Health Information System (PHIS) when FSIS import staff reviewed records and discovered that the independent third party carrier did not present the products for USDA inspection at the U.S. point of entry.

FSIS and the company have received no reports of adverse reactions due to consumption of these products. Anyone concerned about a reaction should contact a healthcare provider.




