Below are five (5) key standard precautionary measures providers can take to safely vaccine patients. These range from wearing personal protective equipment (PPE) to hand hygiene.


Take the necessary actions to protect you and your community!



*N-95 is not required for intranasal or oral vaccines. But should be used if you suspect a patient has/been exposed to COVID-19.1



Practice hand hatene. *Goggles or a disposable face shield may be used.1




*Wearing gloves is not a substitute for hand hygiene!

- *Gloves should be utilized1 when giving



*Do not leave used or soiled PPE on surfaces. Directly dispose used and soiled PPE in the trash.2





*Wash your hands before and after patient contact.1
