## Risk factors include:



## **TBI & PAIN**

**72%** of hospital discharges were prescribed an opioid.



## **CHRONIC PAIN**

**51.5%** of people with TBI develop chronic pain.



## Pre-TBI SUBSTANCE ABUSE

**37-66%** of people with TBI, have a pre-injury history of substance misuse.



#### **DEPRESSION**

**42-72%** of people with TBI develop depression.
