Planning Grants, A CDBG program

\$20,000 - 50,000

CDBG is a competitive grant program that uses federal funds to help rural communities improve their quality of life and ensure the health and safety of their citizens. The goal of the Planning Grant program is to encourage communities to plan for projects such as infrastructure, downtown revitalization, and community facilities that support long-term community development efforts.

Proposed projects must:

- Meet a national objective, and
- Be an eligible activity under Section 105(a) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

How can a project meet a national objective?

- Serve a community with \geq 51% LMI,
- Serve a protected class,
- Target slum/blight.

What is an eligible activity?

- Individual project plans and feasibility studies;
- Community development, redevelopment, functional plans;
- Environmental review/assessments;
- Site specific/site control activities.

Applications accepted on a rolling, yearly basis.
