Midwest Benefit Pharmacy was represented by Council Steven Rosenblend; Tom Bernstein, Administrator of the Welfare Fund; and Kevin Bodenhausen, the pharmacist in charge of the facility. The facility is primarily a mail order pharmacy based in Illinois. The operation of the pharmacy is part of the Welfare Fund. The pharmacy is closed door, and only services eligible union members on a limited scope. They do not do any form of compounding, but do deal with controlled substances. They were unaware that there was a licensing requirement in the state of Indiana until it was brought to their attention recently. The board showed concerns because they had been shipping into the state without the proper credentials, but Midwest Benefit Pharmacy made it clear that they want to do right with the State of Indiana.

A motion was made by Member Wall and seconded by Member Landis to issue the pharmacy a probationary license for two years. They may resume shipping into the state when they register with INSPECT. They must submit a copy of all inspections done by Illinois or any other inspection entity to Indiana. They also must keep the Board abreast of the pharmacist in charge at all times.
