II. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the agenda as amended. Laux/McIntosh, 8-0-0, motion carries

III. ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES FROM THE NOVEMBER 15, 2012 MEETING OF THE BOARD

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the November 15, 2012 minutes. Laux/Burghduff, 7-0-1, motion carries (Dolk abstains)

IV. INDIANA STATE NURSES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Chuck Lindquist presented to the Board. ISNAP reports a very busy November with a record number of intakes of 51 total in November 2012. 37 RMA's returned, current active clients are 571. Educational efforts continue to go on as Roxanne Thomas works as a volunteer with the program and Jane Willis (formerly of Methodist) is now in Avon and continuing to work on ISNAP in orientation. The next quarterly provider meeting will be held on January 16, 2013 at IU Methodist Behavioral Health.

V. EDUCATION

A. Brown Mackie College- Indianapolis and South Bend campuses- Request for Curriculum Revision (Brenda McAllister)

Staff was present from Brown Mackie. Their curriculum has been outdated, they embarked a year ago on revisions involving all campuses, faculty and students. They added a pharmacology class, dosage calculation class, philosophy is still based on Masewell. They are progressing from simple to complex at this point and three months worth of classes is one quarter for their campuses. They are moving to e-books and have a large library. All students receive an iPad and they are integrating technology in the classroom. They are also working towards NLNAC accreditation at several campuses. They map back objectives to courses and outcomes. Ms. Hall asked about NLNAC accreditation and where they are in the process. They are in the process of submitting candidacy presentations for South Bend and Indianapolis and working on revisions at this time. They have not finished the candidacy part at this time. Ms. Laux asked if their curriculum was competency based or performance based and the staff indicated it is both. They have added the ATI and added the pharmacology and dosage calculations to the ATI. They have a standard of Level 2 for the comprehensive graduation. If students do not achieve Level 2 they go through free remediation. They have two attempts during their last month and if they do not meet the standard

they remediate. Ms. Laux asked about integration of technology. Staff indicated they were previously paper/pencil but are now using ipads, several applications to purchase to aid students in their learning. Ms. Dolk inquired regarding simulation. Staff indicated they have been working on faculty development with didactic staff and coming along with this use. Ms. Dolk asked about % of sim vs. clinical and staff indicated each campus was different. At South Bend, they use Noel birthing simulation for upper levels and have a virtual clinical classroom working with theory, assessment, med/surg and critical decision making. Ms. Laux asked about retakes and staff indicated if staff fails the same class more than once it is a dismissal. After the third core curriculum failure in multiple classes, there is permanent dismissal with no appeal. Ms. Cooper asked about their grading scale and inquiring about the "D+". Staff indicated that is in the general curriculum but in the nursing program if you get less than 80% it is a failure. Staff indicated one student remains in the Merrillville campus. Ms. Narwold asked about admissions criteria and they have not done so in Indiana at this time. Mr. Burghduff asked if there was a plan to re-open Merrillville and Fort Wayne if this curriculum change is successful. Staff indicated there was no plan to do so at this time. Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to accept. Laux/McIntosh, 8-0-0, motion carries

B. Medtech Fort Wayne ASN Program Site Revisit, September 2012 (McIntosh/Burghduff)

Note: All nursing programs at this campus placed on conditional accreditation in April 2012.

Staff from Medtech Fort Wayne was present regarding the site visit. Ms. McIntosh indicated a site visit was conducted in Spring 2012. The current site visit was a revisit of the prior visit. There was evidence found again that administrators at the time continued the practice to allow a student to continue classes without a GED. Staff indicated that no student is allowed to start classes without an official transcript from high school. Ms. McIntosh then indicated on the second site visit there issues regarding safety of records and the filing system. Medtech staff now holds a weekly meeting with the program director and registrar to sign off on official proof of graduation and a double check is completed again before the beginning of the quarter. Ms. McIntosh also indicated that Ms. Herman personally knew about this situation when she hired on in July 2012 and that she personally went through every single record. Ms. McIntosh asked the status of the records now- do all students have proper documentation. Ms. Herman indicated that 100% of the students have the appropriate records now. All of the administrators have changed since the initial site visit in the of Spring 2012 and seem to be putting appropriate weight towards fixing these issues. Confidentiality remained an issue re: faculty discussing grades in common areas, etc. Staff indicated that they have expanded the third floor, dedicated an area to the nursing faculty with a conference room and private offices and several in-services have taken place regarding confidentiality and FERPA training. Ms. McIntosh asked about support from the parent company because in the initial survey staff indicated things would be changed and none of them were changed. Also, on the second site visit staff shared that no one from corporate had come to help. Leadership has been changed including the chief regulatory officer and Ms. Herman's direct supervisor has changed. The parent company has been to the campus and the COO and vice-president have been there five times since the last site visit. Mr. Burghduff indicated they also need to address the complaint regarding the ASN program. One of the things in speaking with faculty was that some felt grades were being changed by administration without their input- what has been done to address that issue? Staff indicated they have changed the grade appeal process and faculty are now included in the process and were not included previously. This particular policy changed in July 2012. Ms. McIntosh indicated this was a difficult visit because what they saw was not high standards but all administrators have been changed and current administrators appear to be working hard. They saw students that really want to move forward. Ms. Laux asked about ratio from admission to graduation as well. The recommendation is to stay on conditional accreditation with bi-monthly visits to the Board by Ms. Herman and Ms. Bragg regarding records, admissions processes, changes in policies, etc. It will be revisited during the yearly accreditation process in April 2012. Laux/Burghduff, 8-0-0, motion carries

C. Brown Mackie Fort Wayne Site Visit September 2012 (Narwold/Dolk)

Ms. Narwold indicated the site visit was due to the fact that a faculty member in their nursing program was teaching and had an encumbered license. Ms. Narwold and Ms. Dolk reviewed all faculty files, interviewed the head of the Nursing program and the head of the campus. The faculty member was dismissed upon discovery of the encumbered status. They felt no additional action needed to be done at that time. McIntosh/Burghduff, 8-0-0, motion carries

D. Indiana State University Progress Report

Staff appeared on behalf of Indiana State University. They addressed highlights in the plan of correction. Their NCLEX pass rates have improved significantly. First quarter 92- 2nd quarter 100 3rd quarter 92% total for year to date is 102/111 for 91.89% pass rate. The report addressed all prior areas outlined in the plan of correction. There is no action to be taken at this time, the progress report was accepted and a site visit will be scheduled. McIntosh/Burghduff, 8-0-0, motion carries

E. Ivy Tech Kokomo, Request for Expansion of ASN Program to Peru

Staff appeared on behalf of Ivy Tech Kokomo. Ms. Narwold asked how many applicants have shown interest at the Peru site. Staff indicated they usually have 100-120 applicants with only 30 accepted per session. In the past, they enrolled 50 in this program. Ms. Narwold asked if they would apply to Kokomo and be assigned to either Kokomo or Peru. Logansport also has a 6 semester part-time program at this time. Would students go to Peru for clinical? Staff indicated Dukes Hospital Foundation has provided a three year grant for clinicals. Ms. McIntosh asked about faculty. Staff indicated they have MSN prepared faculty and qualified applicants for the positions. Ms. Hall asked about the 2011 pass rate for Ivy Tech Kokomo- staff indicated it was around 86%. Staff indicated their unofficial current pass rate for 2012 at the Ivy Tech Kokomo campus is 93%. Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to approve the request for expansion. McIntosh/Laux, 5-1-2 (Hall against, Cooper and Dolk abstain)

H. Tucker Career & Technology Center/Marion Community Schools LPN Program Site Visit, December 2012 (McIntosh) Dr. Folks, McCammon, Aaron Vermillion school board president

Staff appeared from Tucker Career & Technology Center. Ms. McIntosh indicated that a site visit was conducted on November 30, 2012 and a follow-up on December 4, 2012. Ms. McIntosh asked when the program director left. Staff indicated she left on 11/6/12. There was no full-time faculty in place at the time of the visit. They were utilizing substitutes. Since that time, they have suspended classes and students have been contacted knowing classes were postponed and the earliest they would return would be 12/17/12. They have an LPN director candidate they are going through the process of and have one full-time and two-half time candidates in the process. No faculty has started at this time. Ms. Laux asked how they were offering classes without faculty. They had one faculty member in place until 11/21/12 and they had a former LPN director in place. Ms. Laux asked how many students were there- staff indicated they had 49 students. Students were not in clinical at that time. Ms. Cooper asked how the LPN faculty that was "borrowed" from the CNA program was prepared, staff indicated she was an RN with a masters degree but they were not sure what her master's degree was in. Ms. Hall asked how a student was teaching the class the day of the site visit. Staff indicated how McCammon was not there and Ms. Laux indicated students should not be left alone to teach themselves. McCammon indicated a staff member RN was supposed to be present that day as a fill-in instructor but had called in sick. McCammon could not speak as to a student teaching the class. Ms. Hall asked who was in charge when she was not there. McCammon indicated district administration were aware she was gone that it should be the secondary curriculum coordinator. Folks indicated that they would like to move forward in what they can do to see these students through to graduation. Ms. Hall indicated it will be resolved but we also need to find out how this will not happen again that paying students are teaching themselves and not learning what they are paying to be taught. Ms. Hall indicated the students were also in a clinical setting where tragic things have occurred as well. Ms. Laux indicated all of these issues go to judgment and how you come to conclusions and make decisions that led to this visit. Ms. Dolk indicated there is a clear disconnect between what you are responsible for in K-12 and what you are responsible for in Nursing programs. Ms. Dolk indicates from their admission those standards have not been met and they need to come to a resolution that will benefit the program. Ms. McIntosh indicated she wanted to talk about one student who had a number of complaints and the status of that student. McCammon indicated she cannot speak towards the VA clinical hours as they occurred under the former LPN program director as no documentation exists. Ms. McIntosh then asked about the drug test of this particular student and Tucker's failure to follow policies. McCammon indicated based on her professional opinion that the student was not impaired. She said she was the only administrator on campus at this time and while working on the investigation the student was allowed to leave the campus. The student is still currently in the program and is on probation. McCammon believed she did not think the student was hostile when asked by Ms. Laux. Ms. Laux also indicated that complaints about the VA would be a red flag, that they should have contacted the VA and asked for a report from them. McCammon indicated she contacted the VA but has not heard back. Mr. Burghduff asked about points of contact at clinical sites and McCammon indicated she has not found any contact list but had contacted people through the MOU process, specifically Marion General. Ms. Dolk asked how persistent she had been in contacting the VA. McCammon indicated she made one phone call and sent one email. McCammon is the building director at Tucker- they do not have an LPN director. Ms. Cooper asked about her "professional opinion" and McCammon indicated she has a masters degree and can base her opinion on that experience. The police officer did not report the incident until after the site visitors came regarding the urine drug screen. Ms. McIntosh also asked about changes and enforcement of policies related to social networking and cell phones and that during their review of students someone was recording the site visitors without their knowledge. Ms. McIntosh indicated that they were not enforcing their own policies related to any of these issues including security, FERPA, teaching, etc. Ms. McIntosh indicated this has been the most brutal experience she has had in her 23 years of Nursing and she does not take this responsibility lightly. To receive a letter that it is the Board's mission to accept the mission and their hope is students graduate, etc. She got his word that he would not blame the Board on closing the program down she does not appreciate them blaming the Board. Board Action: A motion was made and recommended to place on immediate conditional accreditation with temporary suspension of the program for six weeks to get students where they need to be. Development of a corrective action plan with monthly visits to the Board of Nursing and everything that needs documented. Monthly reports from the School Board as well. Site visits will either be unannounced or connected in the next few weeks to get them set up. Should consider holding any additional admissions but we do not have control over that piece at this time. Gordon says they cannot do a temporary suspension at this point in time. Another survey needs to be done as well and then set the matter down for a hearing if they have not satisfied defects to take their accreditation. Burghduff wants to refer matter to AG's office for thorough investigation of fraud involving their students and the profession of Nursing. They can also refer the matter to the State Department of Education as well. Ms. Narwold agrees in terms of the seriousness of the issue and we need to bring out what happened that sparked all of the faculty to walk out and all of the students to complain and we still haven't figured that piece out. Ms. Dolk indicated they should not think about having classes again with an experienced director and faculty. Ms. McIntosh asked Dr. Folks about the overall timeline. Right now, they have candidates that have been interviewed and a prospective director that will go to the Board. Ms. McIntosh indicated it is much more than a staffing issue. Mr. Burghduff asked what the current obligation is to the students. Ms. McIntosh indicated if the school board decided to close or if the student chose to go somewhere else the students would get a full refund. Ms. McIntosh asked if graduation is still planned for August 2013. Dr. Folks indicated that there is a two week summer vacation that could be utilized but it may be later in August 2013 depending on how the program is running. Mr. Burghduff asked about articulation agreements and they currently have none. McCammon has been in contact with Ivy Tech and indicated they cannot transfer credits but may write an articulation agreement with them on classes they have already taken. Ms. Laux indicated you could not utilize ATI to give credit. Ms. Cooper indicated that the individuals sitting here need to determine what their role and obligation is and the safety of these students needs to be taken seriously and they need to make a philosophical decision as to where they stand. Dr. Folks indicates the results of this meeting have not been encouraging to continue their program. Mr. Burghduff indicated the program has defrauded their students and cost them thousands of dollars each. Dr. Folks says they know the standards and want to bring their program up to standards with a partnership. Ms. Laux said the Board is not a consulting company and the faculty of the program should know how to bring them up to standards. Ms. McIntosh indicated whether they would agree to a temporary suspension for six weeks. The school Board discussed the program a year ago and voted to devote \$300,000 in new equipment to the program. He indicated they need to take this back to the

Board to see whether the viability of the program will continue. Ms. Dolk also indicated because they have had a good history they need to do some deep digging to figure out what went wrong and find out the root cause. Mr. Vermillion indicated he knows they have made mistakes and their intent is to do what is best for these students and determine whether it is possible to go forward with their program. Ms. Laux indicated one of the biggest concerns she had is the hostile environment their students are in. Mr. Vermillion agreed over the past three years they have worked hard on safety and their change as a system and he takes those issues very seriously. Ms. Hall asked about next scheduled admission. Those students in two DET's have been contacted and told they will be contact in January with a status. Mr. White asked about suspension of the program. Ms. Hall wants to temporarily suspend new admissions until we see their progress. The next school board meeting is December 19, 2012. They will contact the Board Director with the status after this date re: temporary suspension of the program. Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to accept Ms. McIntosh's recommendation with referral to the DOE and OAG. They will be given until January 31, 2013 to correct these action. McIntosh/Laux, 8-0-0, motion carries Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to place the program on conditional accreditation. The program has until January 31, 2013 to correct the defects identified within the November 30, 2012 site visit report. Further, the Board requested that the matter be referred to the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Education for investigation.


