I. CALL TO ORDER AND ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM

Natalie Hall, President of the Indiana State Board of Nursing, called the meeting to order at 8:53 a.m. and established a quorum in accordance with IC § 25-23-1-5(b).

III. ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 16, 2016 MEETING OF THE BOARD

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the minutes from June 16, 2016, with the following changes: page 3 (K) change concept to content; page 5 (11) change the word distant to distance; page 6 (16) clarify if Stacey Claycamp has a license or not. The language is to be corrected to reflect the actual issue and action taken; page 10 (40) clarify language to indicate what the issue was and what action was taken; page 12 (51) change the word driving to drinking; page 15 (26) clarify language to portray the actual issue and language taken by the board. Cooper/Presley 6-0-0.

IV. INDIANA STATE NURSES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Chuck Lindquist, Director of ISNAP, addressed the board. He presented the June monthly report to the board. ISNA/ISNAP's fall workshop, .Catch me if you can, will be held on August 26, 2016. Mr. Lindquist informs the board that there have been 22 new intakes and 11 of those are self reports. He addressed the students and explained what ISNAP was.

V. EDUCATION

A. Chamberlain College site visit report & response and request for curriculum change (Dr. Margaret Harvey)
Diane Smith Levine and Dr. Margaret Harvey appeared on behalf of the program. Education Compliance Officer Toni Herron stated that the site visit had been completed at the request of the program for upgrade to full accreditation. The program received initial accreditation from ISBN in 2011 and is nationally accredited by the Commission for Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) and the Higher Learning Commission and in Indiana by the Board of Proprietary Education. Chamberlain is a part of the DeVry Education group on a national level. There are currently 241 active students with 13 master's prepared faculty – 11 full time and 2 part time. The simulation lab is managed by a master's prepared RN who works closely with faculty to present scenarios but does not teach or evaluate student performance. The program is in the process of right sizing to fit the available space within their building and part of that plan included taking faculty out of their private offices and a reduction in force by the elimination of the full time on site librarian. Dr. Harvey stated that both of these options have been removed from consideration as a result of the ISBN site visit recommendations. Board member Hall asked if Dr. Harvey had an Indiana nursing license and

Dr. Harvey answered yes. Board member Morrison asked if they would be able to increase enrollment if the demand presented itself. Dr. Harvey stated that the right sizing of the campus would accommodate up to a total of 300 students but that corporate would support further growth if it was indicated. The are right sizing and they can enroll more students if the demand is there. Ms. Herron's recommendations are:

1. Grant full accreditation
 2. Re-evaluate according to ISBN rules
 3. Recommend retention of private faculty offices
 4. Recommend retention of full time on site librarian Cooper/Russell 7-0-0 accept recommendations
- Chamberlain College also submitted revisions to the curriculum for Board approval.
Owens/Rock 7-0-0 accept curriculum revisions.

B. ITT Technical Institute Merrillville monthly written and in person report (Karen Helmecy MSN,RN)
Karen Helmecy, Ruth Clayman and Mariah Wood appeared on behalf of the program. In reviewing Quarter 2 NCLEX scores, Board member Cooper asked how many outliers tested this quarter. Ms. Helmecy stated that she believed there was only one outlier included in these results. Cooper/Beth 7-0-1- accepted report as submitted

C. MJS monthly written report
Ms. Cooper stated some confusion about the number of currently seated students and asked that the program include that information in the August report. Ms. Herron reminded the Board that all schools making quarterly in person appearances would be before them at the August meeting, including MJS. Board member Hall stated that the Board had received an anonymous letter citing concerns with the nursing program at MJS. It is unclear if the letter is from a student or faculty member. Ms. Hall recommends this letter be included in the packet for next month for board member review. Move to accept report as submitted. Cooper/Russell 8-0-0

D. Brown Mackie South Bend written monthly report
Ms. Hall recused herself due to conflict of interest resulting from her employment by Brown Mackie. Board members Cooper, Rock, Owens, Presley, Russell, DeKoninck and Morrison remain. Ms. Cooper stated that the NCLEX pass rates for second quarter 2016 are significantly below scores for first quarter. Motion to accept report as submitted Owens/Rock 7-0-0

I. Fortis College monthly written report
Ms. Hall recused herself and left the room at the request of the program. Board members present include Cooper, Coto, Owens, Russell, Presley, Morrison, Rock and De Koninck. Ms. Russell asked about the information in the report stating that no student grievances were reported. Ms. Russell asked Ms. Herron if she was aware of the grievance process for Fortis. Ms. Herron stated she could look into it and report back but could not remember spontaneously. Ms. Cooper asked for clarification regarding Ms. Darnell's present status. It is unclear from the submitted report if she is still with the program and teaching or has separated from the institution. If she has separated, Ms. Cooper asked about the redistribution of responsibilities. At the time of the last site visit, Ms. Herron stated that Ms. Darnell was teaching 5 classes. Ms. Cooper wants to know who is teaching those classes previously taught by Ms. Darnell and if Ms. Bell-Williams is now teaching, where she had previously been 100 % administrative at their last appearance before the Board. The

submitted report shows the facilities that have been contacted to apply for clinical sites for student experiences. It is unclear from the report what sites are actually in use currently for clinical experience. Ms. Cooper asked for a list in the next report that clearly states which sites are in use for which course, : e.g. Maternal child health – Eskenazi, OB Gyn North and Planned Parenthood; Pediatrics – Kidz Especially, Hamilton County Public Health Department; Med-surg - Springhill Meadows, Westview Hospital etc.

A. Appearances by Applicants for Licensure

1. Melissa Kumpf

RN Endo

Positive Response

Melissa Kumpf appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Kumpf applied for an RN license by Endorsement and answered “yes” to question 1 and 4 on her license application. Her Ohio license is on probation. In April 2013, Kumpf was terminated from Cincinnati Children’s Hospital because she did not document the disposal of a narcotic correctly. The Ohio Board had her evaluated for addiction but they did not find her at risk. Letters of recommendation submitted into file. ALJ Coto recommends that Melissa Kumpf’s license is issued on indefinite probation until she completes her probation in Ohio. As part of her terms, she will be required to submit a signed copy of her Board Order and Quarterly reports. Ms. Kumpf agrees to the terms.

2. William Casteel

RN Exam

Failure to Disclose

William Casteel appeared for a personal appearance. Mr. Casteel applied for an RN license by examination and failed to disclose a criminal matter on his license application. In September 2005, Casteel and 6 other nurses were arrested and charged with neglect of a dependent. He was working as Unit Manager in Brentwood Nursing Home and Rehabilitation in Evansville, IN. Casteel does not remember the details of the case but the charges were dropped. His attorney advised him that since the case was dismissed, he could check no. Casteel has been an LPN for 26 years and has been working with St. Mary’s home for 5 years. Letters of recommendation submitted into file. Due to the age of the case, ALJ Coto recommends that William Casteel’s is issued free and clear.

3. Jessica Young

LPN Endo

Failure to Disclose

Jessica Young appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Young applied for an LPN license by Endorsement and failed to disclose a criminal matter on her license application. Young holds an active and unencumbered license in Kansas. In August 2001, Young got into an altercation with her boyfriend. She was trying to leave and he refused to give her the car keys. She struck his hand with a flip flop. Her boyfriend’s sister called the police and Young was arrested. She entered a diversion program for a year and the charges were dropped. Due to the age of the case, ALJ Coto recommends that Jessica Young’s license is issued free and clear.

4. Tanya McClendon-Laners **RN Exam** **Previous Testing Attempts VACATED**

5. Dana Clinton **RN Exam** **Grad Date 2005/Previous Testing Attempts**
Dana Clinton appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Clinton applied for an RN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on her license application. In 2006, Clinton had fired her personal injury attorney and filed a complaint for a conflict of interest. Shortly after, she was accused of sending threatening correspondence in the mail. She found out that it was a cartoon comic. Clinton was charged with intimidation and resisting law enforcement when she refused to give a DNA test. The intimidation charge was dropped but she took a plea agreement for the resisting law enforcement and was put on 1 year probation. Clinton graduated from Ivy Tech Community College in May 2005. This will be her 3rd attempt. Her last exam was in 2006. Clinton went to back to school for Healthcare Management. She was told it would help for her to have the RN license. She is currently working on a review course for the NCLEX. She currently had an active and unencumbered LPN license. Letters of recommendation submitted into her file. ALJ Coto recommends that she completes a review course with a 95% probability of passing letter. Dana Clinton's license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

6. Jessica McAfee **RN Exam** **Positive Response**

Jessica McAfee appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. McAfee applied for an RN License by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on her license application. She was charged with driving while suspended on multiple occasions. McAfee said that she was out of work and could not pay for the traffic tickets at the time. In August 2008, she was in a fender bender. She was scared because of her driving record and left the scene. She was stopped and she was charged with resisting arrest. McAfee's license is still suspended but the tickets have been paid for. She currently works as a CNA at St. Francis. ALJ Coto recommends that Jessica McAfee's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

7. Hannah Welch **RN Exam** **Failure to Disclose**

Hannah Welch appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Welch applied for an RN license by examination and failed to disclose a criminal matter on her license application. In December 2011, Welch was attending a party and had one drink. The police showed up and she was charged with underage drinking. She entered a pre-trial diversion program. Her driver's license was suspended for 6 months and she was required to complete an Alcohol and Drug Education class. A copy of the dismal order submitted into her file. ALJ Coto recommends that Hannah Welch's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

8. Amy Goodpaster **RN Exam** **Failure to Disclose**

Amy Goodpaster appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Goodpaster applied for an RN license by examination and failed to disclose a criminal matter. In 2004, Goodpaster was out with a friend and left with a designated driver. An hour later, the friend she was with called because her ride left without her. Goodpaster picked her up and on their way back, she was pulled over and was charged with a DUI. In 2005, Goodpaster was with a friend to pick up a pizza. A man was being rude and was saying inappropriate things to them. They tried to ignore him but Goodpaster slapped him after he insulted her friend. She was arrested but the charges were dismissed. In 2007, she was charged with a driving while suspended due to an unpaid speeding ticket. She knew she was driving on a suspended license because she was a single mother and it took her an hour to get to work. Goodpaster still drinks socially but does not drink and drive. Due to the age of the charges, ALJ Coto recommends that Amy Goodpaster's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

9. Mackenzie Wolf **RN Exam** **Positive Response**

Mackenzie Wolf appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Wolf applied for an RN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on her license application. In September 2015, Wolf was arrested for an OVI in Cincinnati, OH. She had finished her clinicals for the day and was offered to attend a concert with a friend. She hadn't eaten anything that day and had a few crackers. When she arrived at the concert she had 2 drinks. After the concert, they went to the Casino across the street and drank water to sober up. On her way home, she was pulled over for touching the double yellow line. Her blood alcohol level was .01. She admitted she had been drinking at a concert and pled guilty. The case was lowered to a reckless operation. She was fined \$200 and driver's invention program, and 6 months probation that ended in May 2016. Due to the low BAL and that she completed her criminal probation, ALJ Coto recommends that Mackenzie Wolf's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

10. Tiarra Gardner**LPN ENDO****Failure to Disclose –CONTINUED****11. Richard Fowler****RN Exam****Failure to Disclose**

Richard Fowler appeared for a personal appearance. Mr. Fowler applied for RN license by examination. The incident happened after he was approved to take the NCLEX. In May 2016, Fowler was at a friend's house to celebrate graduating Nursing School. He had 4 drinks and waiting an hour and a half before leaving. They stopped at a bar but he did not have any drinks and felt fine. On his way home, he rolled through a stop sign and was pulled over. He was arrested and his blood alcohol level was .118. Letters of recommendation were submitted into his file. Due to his honesty, ALJ Coto recommends that Fowler receive an ISNAP evaluation. If he is deemed not a candidate, he may be issued free and clear. If he is a candidate, his license will be issued on indefinite probation for the length of his RMA. As part of his terms, he would be required to submit quarterly reports and copies of a signed board order from his employers.

12. Danyelle Miller**RN Exam****Previous Testing Attempts**

Danyelle Miller appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Miller applied for an RN license by examination. Miller graduated from Purdue University in December 2013 and has failed the NCLEX 3 times. Her last exam was March 2015. Her current employer enrolled her in the Sylvia Rayfield NCLEX Workshop. Miller holds an active and unencumbered LPN license in Indiana and is currently employed. ALJ Coto recommends that Ms. Miller provides a 95% probability of passing letter and additional documentation on what steps she is taking to study. Danyelle Miller's license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

13. Zane Yoho**RN Exam****Positive Response**

Zane Yoho appeared for a personal appearance. Mr. Yoho applied for an RN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on his license application. In October 2014, Yoho attended a Halloween party in Terre Haute, IN where he had several drinks. He left the party and attended to walk through campus to return home. On his walk home, he had vomited and was stopped by a police officer. He did not have a cell phone or his ID with him and was taken to jail for 9 hours and was released for good behavior. Yoho entered a deferral program that he completed March 2015. He was given 30 hours of community service and was required to complete a drug and alcohols classes. Robin Riebsomer, ISNAP Intake Coordinator, does not believe he will need an INSAP evaluation. Letters of recommendation submitted into his file. ALJ Coto recommends that Zane Yoho's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

14. Hannah Wever**LPN Endo****Failure to Disclose/Positive Response****15. Yolanda Slaughter****RN Exam Grad Date 2009/Previous Testing Attempts**

Yolanda Slaughter failed to appear. She may be rescheduled one time.

16. Yolanda Brown**RN Exam Grad Date 2012/Previous Testing Attempts**

Yolanda Brown appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Brown applied for an RN license by examination. She graduated from Breckenridge School of Nursing in 2012 and has failed the exam twice. Her last exam date was May 2014. Brown is enrolled in a review course that she will complete at the end of August. She is currently employed as a medical assistant at an Immediate Care Center through IU Health. According to her last results, she was close to passing in most of the categories. ALJ Coto recommends that Ms. Brown provides the board with a 95% of probability of passing before she can be made eligible to test. Yolanda Brown's license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

17. Marriza Negrete**RN Exam Grad Date 2009/Previous Testing Attempts**

Marriza Negrete appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Negrete applied for an RN license by examination. She graduated from Indiana Dabney University in 2009. She's failed the NLEX 3 times. Her last exam date was 2011. She did not test after the third time because she got married and had children. Negrete currently works as a Medical Liaison at a Long Term Rehabilitation in Valparaiso, IN. She reviews referrals to determine if they meet the criteria for Long Term Care. ALJ Coto recommends that Ms. Negrete provides the board with a 95% probability of passing letter before she can be made eligible to test. Marriza Negrete's license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

18. Kia Tate**LPN Endo****Failure to Disclose**

Kia Tate appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Tate applied for an LPN license by Endorsement and failed to disclose a criminal matter on her license application. She holds an active and unencumbered license in Illinois. Ms.

Tate said that she does not know what the criminal charges were and said it could have been from unpaid tickets. Tate submitted a statement to IPLA stating that in 2009 she was in a car accident. She was arrested for tapping a police officer on the shoulder to get his attention but the charge was dismissed. She was fined for traffic violations that have been paid. ALJ Coto recommends that Kia Tate's license is issued free and clear.

19. Nina Hutton-McGlown

RN Endo

Failure to Disclose

Nina Hutton-McGlown appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Hutton-McGlown applied for RN license by endorsement and failed to disclose a criminal matter on her license application. She holds an active and unencumbered license in Illinois and Iowa. Her Washington license is expired. In February 2011, she was attending her son's basketball game. The opposing team was losing and the kids started to fight. Her son was pushed to the floor and she got upset and shouted that she had enough and that she pulling her son from the game. The peace officer asked her to leave. She said she wasn't leaving without her son but the officer would not let her get him. She was charged with trespassing and resisting law enforcement. She currently works as a travel nurse. ALJ Coto recommends that Nina Hutton-McGlown's license is issued free and clear.

20. Karina Payne

RN Exam

Previous Testing Attempts

Karina Payne appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Payne applied for an RN license by examination. She has failed the NCLEX 3 times. Her last exam date was February 2016. She completed the Kaplan review course May 2016 and submitted a copy with her application. ALJ Coto recommends that Ms. Payne is free to test. Karina Payne's license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

21. Ashley Gantner

RN Endo

Positive Response

Ashley Gantner appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Gantner applied for an RN license by Endorsement and answered "yes" to question 3 on her license application. Gantner holds an active and unencumbered license in Missouri. Her license in Nebraska is expired. She works as a flight nurse. In July 2012, she was charged with a DWI. She entered program similar to a deferral. She completed all her obligations issued by the court and the charges were dismissed in September 2012. She worked in an intensive care unit and can see the consequences of driving while intoxicated. ALJ Coto recommends that Ashley Gantner's license is issued free and clear.

22. Desiree Bearden

LPN Endo

Failure to Disclose

Desiree Bearden appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Bearden appeared for an LPN license by Endorsement and failed to disclose a criminal matter on her license application. She holds an active and unencumbered license in Kentucky. She did not know the charges were still on her record. She had joined the Marine Corps and it did not appear then. In 2009, her ex wrote a check out in her name without her permission. She did not know about it until she was pulled over and was arrested. The charges were dismissed. ALJ Coto recommends that Desiree Bearden's license is issued free and clear.

23. Courtney Mathis

RN Exam

Previous Testing Attempts

Courtney Mathis appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Mathis applied for an RN license by examination. She graduated from University of Saint Francis in 2015 and has failed the NCLEX 3 times. Her last exam date was May 2016. Mathis completed the Kaplan review course and is working on another review program called UWorld. She was scored low in Pharmacology and Risk Potential. ALJ Coto recommends that Mathis provides the Board with a 95% probability of passing letter before she can be made eligible to test. Courtney Mathis' license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

24. Donalda Antrup

LPN Endo

Positive Response

Donalda Antrup appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Antrup applied for an LPN license by Endorsement and answered "yes" to question 3 and 4 on her license application. She is currently holds an active and unencumbered license in Michigan. Her license in Alabama and North Carolina is inactive. In August 1990, she was 19 years old. She was charged with theft in North Dakota. In April 2014, she was arrested for Malicious Destruction of Property in Michigan. She received money from the VA for her injuries while she was serving. Her husband had withdrawn money from her account without her permission. She was angry at him and rear ended his truck twice. In April 2014, she was arrested for failure to appear in a court due to a hospital bill the VA failed to pay. She had been terminated for leaving medication by the bedside. She was working a lot of overtime and was not taking care of herself. Copies of

Certificate of Release/Discharge of Active Duty submitted into her file. ALJ Coto recommends that Donalda Antrup's license is issued free and clear.

25. Kimberly Lee **RN Endo** **Failure to Disclose**
Kimberly Lee failed to appear. She may be rescheduled one time.

26. Jacob Morgan **RN Exam** **Positive Response**
Jacob Morgan appeared for a personal appearance. Mr. Morgan applied for an RN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on his license application. In April 2010, he was charged with an OWI in Bloomington, IN. He was required to complete 30 hours of community service, drug and alcohol classes, Victim Impact Panel, and a year of probation. In August 2014, he was in California visiting friends. As they were entering a music venue, his friend asked to grab his wallet for him out of the car. When he entered, the police found a narcotic in the wallet. The charge was lowered from a Felony to a Misdemeanor because California had changed their laws. A copy of court documents from California was submitted into his file. ALJ Coto recommends that Jacob Morgan's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

27. Hanna Merz **RN Exam** **Positive Response**
Hanna Merz appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Merz applied for an RN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on her license application. In February 2012 and May 2012, she was charged with minor consumption. She was a freshman at IUPUI and living on campus. In both instances, she was drinking with friends in the apartment she was staying in. She completed a diversion program and the charges were dismissed. ALJ Coto recommends that Hanna Merz's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

28. Brittany Malone **RN Exam** **Failure to Disclose**
Brittany Malone appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Malone applied for an RN license by examination and failed to disclose a criminal matter on her license application. Malone did not answer yes because she believed they were to be minor traffic violations. She received many traffic tickets that lead up to her driver's license to be suspended. In December 2008, March 2009, and August 2010 she was arrested for driving while suspended. She said that the August 2013 speeding in a construction zone was her little sister who looks a lot like her. She had used Malone's driver's license to get out of a ticket. She tried to have the record removed but was unsuccessful. ALJ Coto recommends that Brittany Malone's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

29. Justin Gard **RN Exam** **Positive Response**
Justin Gard appeared for a personal appearance. Mr. Gard applied for an RN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3. In August 2015, Gard was at a family reunion and had a few drinks. Everyone wanted to go to a bar but he stayed behind and went to bed. He got a call a few hours later and they asked for a ride home. He thought he would be okay to drive and went to pick them up. When he was pulling into his driveway, a police officer came up and said that he didn't use a turn signal and come to complete when pulling onto his street. Gard admitted he had been drinking and was arrested. He went to court and the charges were lowered to reckless driving. He was required to attend alcohol classes and defensive driving. His criminal probation ended February 2016. ALJ Coto recommends that Justin Gard's license is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

30. Jamie Mills **RN Exam** **Failure to Disclose**

Bertha Kachingwe appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Kachingwe applied for an RN license by examination and failed to disclose a criminal matter on her license application. In 2003, she was arrested for battery. She does not remember committing the crime. She went to jail but her friend bailed her out. She went to court and she was told that she was involved in a fight. He told them it was not her but she does remember her bag and wallet was stolen around

that time. When he bag was stolen, she filed a police report and provided them a copy. The judge had her complete an anger management evaluation and dismissed the case. ALJ Coto recommends that Bertha Kachingwe's license is issued free and clear.

ALJ Coto recommends that she provides the Board with a 95% probability of passing letter before she can be made eligible. Daiva Gailiuviene's license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

Jama Childress appeared for a personal appearance. Ms. Childress applied for an LPN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on her license application. ALJ Coto recommends that she provides the board with a 95% probability of passing letter to the Board before she can be made eligible to test. Marquita Maldonado's license may be issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX.

38. Alexander Holtz

Positive Response

Alexander Holtz appeared for a personal appearance. Mr. Holtz applied for an RN license by examination and answered "yes" to question 3 on his license application. Holtz admits that he has a history of opiate abuse. In March 2015, he was returning home after having several drinks at a friend's house. His car got stuck on the train tracks and he called 911. He spent 40 hours in jail and pled guilty to an OWI. He was placed on 1 year probation and underwent a Substance abuse Evaluation. He self-reported to ISNAP and signed a 3 year monitor agreement. ALJ Coto recommends that Tiemann provides the board with a 95% probability of passing letter before she can be made eligible to test. In January 2006, she was charged with driving while suspended. In July 2007, she was charged with disorderly conduct when her mother passed away, the hospital would not let Stone see her. 
