II. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the agenda as amended. Cooper/Laux, 7-0-0, motion carries

III. ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 20, 2014 MEETING OF THE BOARD

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the minutes from the February 2014 board meeting. Burghduff/Laux, 7-0-0, motion carries

IV. INDIANA STATE NURSES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Mr. Lindquist appeared on behalf of the Indiana State Nurses Assistance Program. Six applications for the needs assistance fund were approved this month. ISNAP has added upgrades to their social media offerings and will have their frequently asked questions on their website by the end of the month. Employers can now access and complete their employer reports online through the Affinity system. The last quarter of 2013 quarterly compliance- they are seeing less significant non-compliance. Mr. Lindquist then addressed the audience regarding the ISNAP program.

V. EDUCATION

A. Indiana University Northwest BSN Program-Request for Revised Mission, BSN Philosophy, Program Outcomes and Curriculum (Linda Delunas)

Ms. Delunas appeared on behalf of IU Northwest. They have revised their mission and philosophy and worked with other IU campuses to revise their program outcomes. They felt the mission could use more alignment to reflect the commitment to the community they serve. New changes would include lifespan approach to the med/surg classes, not having a separate pediatrics course but covering this in other classes including clinicals, etc. A motion was made and seconded to approve the request. McIntosh/Presley, 6-0-1, motion carries (Laux abstains)

B. Marian University BSN Program- Request for Curriculum Change (Anita Siccardi)

Ms. Siccardi appeared on behalf of Marian University with staff. They have achieved a 10 year accreditation from CCNE in 2011 and began to assess their curriculum after that event. Faculty reviewed their mission, philosophy and framework by looking at essentials, QSEN and their philosophy to reframe the curriculum. They have put in writing and critical

thinking skills, clustering content, with a total assessment of the entire curriculum. Ms. Cooper asked about their credit creep and their concerns. Staff indicated there is no change in the total number of credit hours but they have combined pediatrics and ob from 10 credits to 7 and redistributed the three credits elsewhere. Ms. McIntosh asked about the Nursing 493 course. Staff indicated they are looking at transition and lifelong learning concepts. The class does not have a clinical component. Ms. McIntosh asked if there is a Capstone and staff indicated it is incorporated into their Nursing 451 course. A motion was made and seconded to approve the curriculum. McIntosh/Dolk, 7-0-0, motion carries

C. Vincennes University ASN Program- Request for Curriculum Change (Mistene Halter)

Ms. Halter and staff appeared on behalf of Vincennes University. They are asking to remove Chemistry 101(which was previously a prerequisite) they have worked within departments to incorporate this into the microbiology course. They would be reducing the total program hours by 4 credits. They formed a credit hour reduction committee which incorporated ASN and BSN members, reviewed all general education syllabi in the curriculum to look at duplications, they felt as though the chemistry course was high level and most of the Advanced Practice Nurses felt that was not necessary for the ASN level nurse. The impetus to reduce hours came from state education regulations and they had to reduce somewhere. Ms. McIntosh indicates there is a connection between the math and science areas and fundamentals that is proven. She asked what the plan is to track failures in fundamentals, etc. Ms. Dolk asked about microbiology and why they changed from transfer in course to non-transfer in course. Staff indicated that decision was made by the biology department and not the nursing department. Staff indicated that Vincennes participates in the core 30 and will transfer that entire core of credit hours. Ms. Cooper asked about whether the microbiology is geared to nursing specifically and staff indicated anyone in health sciences can take the course. Ms. McIntosh indicated they will be held to the same requirements as now with this change. **Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to accept the curriculum change.** McIntosh/Laux, 7-0-0, motion carries

D. MedTech College Greenwood, Indianapolis and Fort Wayne Campuses Monthly Progress Reports

Note: MedTech College Greenwood Campus- Monica Baugh MSN, RN named Program Director effective February 24, 2014 replacing Debra Zanders.

Myra Selby appeared on behalf of MedTech College. Monica Baugh was introduced as the new director for the Greenwood campus. Ms. McIntosh asked about improvements.

Ms. Selby noted the following:

- Consolidated report was filed by all three campuses;
- Change in admission standards for the PN program and the ASN program requirements for review and requesting approval of that change.
- Ms. Cooper asked about the report and admissions with passing the TEAS test and what that means. They have decided upon new cut scores. For summer quarter beginning July 2014, 58.7% RN program composite score with breakdown of separate scores for math/science/English/reading and LPN cut score would not change. Board expressed concerns on these as 2/3 or 60% of questions can be missed and move forward.
- Ms. Baugh indicated they are trying to focus on RN program right now due to their NCLEX scores.
- Ms. Dolk asked about 2014 pass rates- Greenwood 88% and RN 65%.
- Ms. Cooper asked about their reflection on changes to NCLEX PN that will occur this year and the combination of these low TEAS scores.
- The Nursing team met across all three campuses led by Vice President for Nursing which culminated in revisions to policies and procedures which have been formulated into the new Student Handbook with policies to take effect in the Spring quarter.
- They have filed faculty reports for all three campuses and student surveys as well for all three campuses.
- Meeting minutes are attached to their monthly report for faculty meetings occurring since February 20, 2014.
- They have tried to summarize the recommendations from the February 2014 Board meeting and looking at strategies for improving communications with students such as monthly student newsletter, WIFI is now available on all three campuses, and utilization of WIFI for the student survey process.
- Clinical coordinator job is posted on all three campuses with a consistent job description.
- Simulation coordinator job is posted as well with a consistent job description.
- Areas of focus identified by students in their meetings- the jumping off point by the VP of Nursing was the summary of the survey responses taken from students that was provided to MedTech after the February 2014 Board meeting to communication, student advising, success strategies, preparation for testing and clinical experiences as well. Staff indicated the program directors have put together an action plan for areas of concern. Board members asked for the action plan that has been developed.

- Ms. Cooper asked about the Greenwood meeting minutes and indicated that meeting minutes are a one person show with no action plan and no interaction through the various levels. Ms. Cooper indicated that the action plan needs to be fulfilled because the Board cannot see the faculty involvement. Ms. Baugh indicated they have a plan in place to improvement minutes and action steps.
 - Ms. McIntosh asked which policies were changed and how it was filtered back to faculty and staff. Ms. Baugh indicates that on page 2 of the report attendance, code of conduct, etc. She indicates all areas were evaluated for example changing their grading scale to 78% from 70% for core courses and for non-core courses the passing rate will be 75%. The Board requested a copy of the new student handbook. Ms. Dolk asked about how faculty changed the policy, they completed research on different passing levels in relation to NCLEX scores and NCLEX success.
 - Ms. McIntosh asked about whether students can pass although they fail the exams- Ms. Baugh indicated the grading scale is being changed so that this is not possible so that completing assignments and failing the exams will not allow a student to pass.
 - Ms. Cooper asked about information faculty have been told through faculty minutes. Ms. Cooper indicated there is still a disconnect between the administration and faculty. Ms. Cooper asked if students were a part of the change process. Ms. Baugh indicated they are not now, but they will be.
 - Mr. Burghduff indicated that he is encouraged with their monthly report this month as though they are beginning to address the action steps.
 - Ms. Laux asked what level proficiency is set at for ATI testing for specific courses. Currently for RN it is 52 composite, 41.7 PN. Ms. Laux asked about content area and it would be Level 2. Ms. Laux had a recommendation about specific faculty and not doing names and specifics on each faculty member. Ms. Laux again asked that faculty be certified in their content area so that content delivered is there.
 - Ms. McIntosh asked about definition of Spring quarter- it begins April 16, 2014.
 - Ms. McIntosh asked who will be responsible for student advising and indicated that faculty is stretched very thin. Ms. Baugh indicated they are at 25-28 faculty contact hours per week face to face with students and 10 to 12 hours of office hours. Each faculty member is assigned a group of students for advising purposes. Ms. Dolk indicated there is at least 35 hours of face to face a week. Ms. Dolk asked when faculty can do research to augment their lectures and the Board expressed concerns that this is not workable.
 - Ms. Ogle indicated that this is a journey for MedTech and that they should be applauded for taking this seriously and beginning to put things together. Ms. Ogle encourages development of an action plans which sets dates, objectives and goals with defined timelines.
 - Ms. McIntosh stressed communication throughout the organization, clinical weaknesses, helping faculty success, etc.
 - Ms. Cooper asked about the surveys and revising this process. Ms. Cooper stressed communication still remains a huge concern throughout the survey and not having grades available for students. Ms. Cooper asked about how snow days were covered and students finding their own clinical sites.
 - Students still cite broken equipment in the labs and this is still not fixed.
 - Ms. Selby indicates they have done a deep dive into the student complaints and the Board would like to see that document as well.
 - Ms. Cooper found this to be more forthcoming and open this morning.
- Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to accept the monthly reports. McIntosh/Laux, 7-0-0, motion carries**

E. FYI Only- ITT Tech Breckenridge School of Nursing- Fort Wayne Campus- Angela Kline named interim Program Director August 2013, Christine West named Campus Dean effective August 2013, Linda Morningstar named Nursing Chair effective March 10, 2014.

F. ITT Technical Institute- Student Progression Request (Sarah Seaton)

Ms. Seaton came to the Board requesting clarification on their student progression request. They are scaling back starts to two times a year but now not every class is offered every quarter. They have students recruited for the March start that have nothing to take until June due to transfer credits. They would catch up with the March cohort if they started in June. They are not asking for an increase in student numbers, they are already a part of the population but would incorporate in June. This may happen with each start because students are transferring in these credits. New students are starting now two times a year in March and September. Ms. Dolk said they will be accepted in March but start in June. Ms. Seaton also asked about students that exit the program prior to graduation and want to re-enter can they re-enter at non-new start

times. The Board indicated they would be out of progression but they are not new students so admissions would not be limited for them. **Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to accept the request. McIntosh/Cooper, 7-0-0, motion carries**

I. Education Compliance Officer Report (Toni Herron)

Ms. Herron presented information including the following:

- NCSBN will be implementing a 10 digit code for testing for the NCLEX effective 4/1/14. The old five digit code will be accepted until 8/31/14. Deans and Directors and staff have already been notified of this change.
- The IPLA/ISBN website recently increased its transparency with the addition to all programs accredited by ISBN with the following information: (1) dean or director; (2) street address and phone number; (3) last two years of annual reports and (4) last five years of NCLEX scores. Thank to Ms. Herron and Ms. Smith on the IPLA/ISBN staff for this improvement.

VI. DISCUSSION

A. Indiana State Nurses Association (Gingy Harshy-Meade)

Ms. Harshy-Meade appeared on behalf of the Indiana State Nurses Association. She provided a strategic plan for the ISNAP process. Ms. Ogle indicated the question is what the schedule is. Ms. Harshy-Meade indicated the plan should be complete by the end of this month. They are still working on the professional videos and hope to have those complete in the near future. Ms. McIntosh asked about use of laptops in Board meetings and Ms. Harshy-Meade indicated that information which is not available in paper will be available via laptop.

Mr. White explained that the State filed motions to consolidate these hearings so that they are heard at the same time. He explained that this is allowable under AOPA, but there must be a pre-hearing conference prior to the hearings if they are consolidated. **Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to deny the request. Burghduff/Dolk, 6-1-0, motion carries (Ogle against)**

C. Order for Indiana Dabney University

Mr. White indicated that he is in the process of drafting a final order for this matter. The Board has been provided with a copy of the draft order for review. The effective date of the order is the date of mailing, and the order has not been mailed out yet. The Board discussed the effective date of the order and there is a graduating class who is on the cusp of taking the NCLEX and tying up their accreditation date, etc. The effective date of the order is usually mailing but the Board has the option of picking a later effective date or staying the order to allow these students to take the NCLEX. IDU has hired counsel and will likely be seeking a stay in this matter. The matter was tabled to return to this afternoon.

In the afternoon, discussion resumed. Ms. Cooper indicated that 23/26 students were seated to graduate in May 2014. There are two other cohorts that are much further out. On hearing date in February 2014, another cohort was identified that was doing Capstone with 17 students in that group. Mr. White indicated they are legally obligated to get the order out within 90 days of the hearing. Mr. White advised that he is hesitant to set a moving target for the date. Ms. McIntosh indicated that if students have completed they need to have the opportunity to take the NCLEX; however, she did not think that the freshmen should be allowed to continue. Mr. Burghduff asked if suspension of all other cohorts except the graduating class can be suspended. Mr. White advised that the question is more complicated than that. Ms. Laux indicated that Boards close schools everywhere so where is research that shows how other Boards do that. Mr. White indicated he has not done any research on that. Ms. Ogle indicated that Mr. White is the legal counsel and couldn't he craft an order that compiles with this? Mr. White indicated he can try to write something as long as he knows how the Board wants to approach this. Mr. Burghduff indicates their purpose is to ensure public health and safety and now compassion is coming into play and he does not want to back pedal. Ms. Cooper indicated that she believes the order should read effective May 31, 2014. Ms. Ogle indicated that if it was so bad why are we giving

them until May 31, 2014? Mr. Burghduff indicates they had a full Board hearing, the Board took a vote and the vote is final. Ms. McIntosh indicated this is not about overturning the order; it is simply the date of effectiveness. Ms. Ogle struggles with allowing the students to test. Ms. McIntosh indicates there is a safety with them taking the NCLEX and with multiple attempts the 95% probability, etc. Mr. White indicated he still wanted a date certain to make it clear for everyone. Ms. Ogle asked for the order to be written, review for legal consequences for the Board and allow them to have input. Ms. Ogle asked for information with the least risk available. The Board members agreed to review this order individually so that there will be no violation of the open door law and to get the order out soon.

- The third in a series of discussions about national Nursing licensure, entitled Executive Officer Forum III, is taking place March 23-25 in Chicago.

She wants to move to Indiana. In January of 2013 she had an impaired driving for alcohol. It was originally an OWI. Her Michigan license is aware of the issue and her license is active. She is not on any kind of probation. She has not had any other issues. Ms. Preston recommended her endorsement free and clear.
 17. Julie Adkins RN Endo CBC Hit/ Positive Response
Ms. Adkins did not appear for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. Ms. Preston recommended this matter be rescheduled.
 18. Irene Oliver LPN Endo CBC Hit/ Positive Response
Ms. Oliver appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She had a disorderly conduct. Her son's father didn't report him home and she made a report. Ms. Preston recommended she take a review course and submit documentation showing that she has a 95% chance or greater of passing the NCLEX. Once this is received she will be allowed to test and her license is to be issued free and clear.
 20. Amanda Coppes RN Exam CBC Hit
Ms. Coppes appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She was arrested for failure to stop at the scene of the accident in February 2014. Drugs and alcohol was not involved in the accident. She had a DUI in 2010 that was reported for the board the first time she

Ms. Menendez appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She last took the NCLEX in October. She is currently doing a review. Ms. Preston recommended she complete the review course. She must submit documentation showing she has a 95% chance or greater of passing the NCLEX. Once this is received she will be allowed to test and her license to be issued free and clear


For Renewal
