# ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE RECCOMENDATIONS (TO BE APPROVED)

#### Personal Appearances. The following Personal Appearances were heard on May 5, 2016, by ALJ Russell.

I.

A. For Licensure Personal appearances were held in Conference Center Room 1 at 8:30 a.m

1. Gary Peterson RN Exam Failure to Disclose

Mr. Peterson appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He failed to disclose a DUI that took place three years ago. There were two passengers in the car and one of them had a pipe. He was charged with possession of a pipe. The charges were dropped. He provided documentation showing the matter was dismissed.

ALJ Russell recommends the following: Mr. Peterson be allowed to test and his license be issued free and clear upon passage.

## 2. Maryam Musa LPN Exam Grad Date 2012/ Previous testing attempts

Ms. Musa appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. Ms. Musa graduated from nursing school in 2012. This will be her 5<sup>th</sup> time taking the exam. She is currently taking a review course. She should be finished by December. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test after providing the board with documentation showing she has at least a 95% chance or greater of passing the NCLEX. Her license is to be issued free and clear upon passage.

## 3. Sapphira Pranger RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Pranger appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2010, she got a misdemeanor for falsely informing. She was at her child's father's house. The police were called and she gave them a false name because she was not suppose to be there. She had another incident. She was charged with minor possession of alcohol. In 2011, she completed all of the probation requirements for that charge. She has learned how to be more responsible since this happened. ALJ Russell recommends the following: Ms. Pranger be allowed to test and her license be issued free and clear upon passage.

## 4. Alyssa Bergdoll RN Exam Failure to Disclose

Ms. Bergdoll appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2013, she had an underage drinking ticket that she thought was expunged. The charges were dismissed. She has learned that she needs to be more responsible. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test and license be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 5. Darrel Murray RN Exam Failure to Disclose

Mr. Murray appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He was arrested 20 years ago. He was under the impression that it was expunged after his 90 day probation period. This was his only issue.

ALJ Russell recommends the following: He be allowed to test and license be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 6. Riley Thompson RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Thompson appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. April 2012, she received a drinking ticket. She had a sober driver that was pulled over for speeding. She went through a diversion program. She learned that this was irresponsible of her and that alcohol and cars do not mix even if you are not driving.

ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test and her license be issued free and clear upon passage.

### 7. Taylor Brenia RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Brenia appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In October 2012, she was charged with minor consumption and possession of fake id. She did pretrial diversion and the matter was dismissed. She supplied the case summary showing the matter had been dismissed. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test and license be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 8. Joel Thompson RN Endo Failure to Disclose

Mr. Thompson appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He answered no to number 3 but has had an arrest. He answered no because he thought it was expunged. This matter happened in 1989. He got into a car of friends. The police had been looking for the car for things the group had been doing. He was not aware of this when he got into the car. ALJ Russell recommends the following: His license be issued free and clear.

#### 9. Roberta Kendall RN Endo Failure to Disclose VACATED

#### 10. David Austin RN Endo Failure to Disclose

Mr. Austin appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He had a DUI 11 years ago. He thought the matter was expunged. He was under the assumption that it was expunged after his probation was completed. ALJ Russell recommends the following: His license be issued free and clear.

#### 11. Janet Johnson LPN Endo Failure to Disclose

Ms. Johnson appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She had two charges, one in 1987 and 1998. She thought the charge in 1987 was expunged. She wasn't aware of the charge in 1998 until she went through this application process. She thought a summons not a charge. ALJ Russell recommends the following: Her license be issued free and clear.

## 12. Jimlo Enriquez LPN Exam Grad Date 2011/Previous testing attempts

Mr. Enriquez appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. Mr. Enriquez graduated from nursing school in 2011. He has previously tested. He took a review course last year but cannot find his receipt or anything. He has been studying with his wife. This will be his fourth time testing. ALJ Russell recommends the following: He be allowed to test after providing the board with documentation showing he has at least a 95% chance or greater of passing the NCLEX. His license is to be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 13. Michael Freeman RN Endo Positive Response

Mr. Freeman appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 2002, he was in the army and was home from an active duty assignment from 6 months in combat. He went to a party and smoked pot. He then failed a urine test. He received a wrongful use conviction. He did everything the military said he needed to do. In 2012, he had a DUI. He had just worked 3 shifts and been up way too long. He went out with friends and was pulled over on his way home.

He completed all the court requirements. ALJ Russell recommends the following: His license be issued free and clear.

## 14. Tonya Powers RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Powers appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2015, she had a DUI. Her BAC was .14. Robin Riebsomer, Intake Coordinator, ISNAP, does not think she will meet criteria for ISNAP. She entered into a deferral program that was completed in February 2016. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She should be allowed to test and her license to be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 15. Oladay Apata RN Endo Failure to Disclose- CONTINUED

# 16. Lori Chambers RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Chambers appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In August 2015, she was charged with theft. She was shopping with her sister-in-law. They placed some things on the bottom of the cart. They had small screaming

children and forgot about the stuff on the bottom of the cart. They were stopped when they tried to leave the store. The police were called. She is currently on a diversion program that will be completed in November. She has paid all the fines. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test. Upon successful passage, her license to be issued on probation until the diversion program is completed.

## 17. Stephanie Bocel-Coj RN Endo Positive Response – VACATED

## 18. Amanda Patton RN Exam Grad Date 2000/previous testing attempts

Ms. Patton appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. Ms. Patton graduated nursing school in 2000. She has previously tested. She has not completed a review course. She is currently an LPN. ALJ Russell made the following recommendation: She be allowed to test after providing the board with documentation showing she has at least a 95% chance or greater of passing the NCLEX. Her license is to be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 19. James Fogle RN Endo Positive Response\*

Mr. Fogle did not appear for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. ALJ Russell made the following recommendation: His application to be denied.

#### 20. John Anguys RN Exam Positive Response

Mr. Anguys appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 1997, he got into trouble for drinking at a park. In 2001, he received a drinking ticket after being at a party in Bloomington. He entered into and completed a pretrial diversion. In 2007, he was charged with possession of marijuana. He was on a fishing trip with friends and they were pulled over. The cop was suspicious so he asked to search the car. A small bag of marijuana was found. He completed the probation and the case was dismissed. Robin Riebsomer, Intake Coordinator with ISNAP, does not think he would meet criteria for an RMA. Since 2007, he has grown up both professionally and personally. ALJ Russell recommends the following: He be allowed to test and license be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 21. Toni Stephen RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Stephen appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She was terminated from her last job for a HIPPA violation. She took a snap chat video of a nurse dancing. In the video you could see a patient label. She no longer keeps her phone on her when she is working and realizes how important HIPPA is. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test and license be issued free and clear upon passage.

## 22. Elizabeth Emmert RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Emmert appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She was charged with resisting arrest after she confronted the officer who was arresting her sister. Her sister had been asked to leave the establishment. This has been the only issue she has ever had. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test and license be issued free and clear upon passage.

#### 24. Samuel Miller LPN Endo Positive Response

Mr. Miller did not appear. This matter is to be rescheduled one time.

#### 25. Sarah McKenzie LPN Exam Positive Response

Ms. McKenzie appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She has had 3 arrests. In 2007 and 2011, she and her husband had gone out and there was a dispute. They were arrested. In 2015, she received an OWI. She was pulled over after leaving a party. She refused the breathalyzer test. Alcohol was also involved in the first two arrests. She is currently on criminal probation. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test. Upon successful passage, her license be issued on probation with the following terms: she complete an ISNAP evaluation, her probation will be the length of the RMA, if meets criteria, or the criminal probation whichever is longer.

### 26. Kathie Lovies LPN Endo Positive Response- VACATED

#### 27. Vinetta Gray RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Gray appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 1989, she was charged with fraud after using a fake credit card. This case was dismissed after a year of probation. In 1993, she was charged with theft and completed probation. In 1995, she was charged with theft and completed probation. In 1995, she was charged with theft. Both of these charges were dismissed. In 2007, she was involved in an altercation with a woman over a man. The police were called. After the other woman told the truth the charges were dismissed. In 2014, she was buying liquor at a cheap price then selling it at a higher price. She completed probation for this in January 2016. Alcohol was not involved in any of these arrests. She knows she has made some bad decisions to make ends meet. She went to nursing school to make a better life for herself and her daughter. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test. Upon successful passage, her license to be issued on probation with the following terms: One year of active practice, quarterly reports, signed board order, and MMPII.

#### 28. Kyle Green RN Exam Positive Response

Mr. Green appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 2013, he had a minor consumption after attending a party. He was not driving when this occurred. He completed a pretrial diversion program. This was his first and only offense. This was a wakeup call for him. ALJ Russell recommends the following: He be allowed to test and upon passage, his license be issued free and clear.

#### 29. Helen Nard LPN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Nard appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She has had 3 arrests. In 2011, she was charged with possession of marijuana. She threw a party. Once of the guests had a warrant out for their arrest. Someone called the police. They found some marijuana. The second arrest was due to missing a court date related to the possession charge. Once she found out there was a warrant for her, she turned herself in. The matter was dismissed after she completed a pretrial program. In 2013, she was charged with maintaining a common nuisance and possession. The house she shared with her boyfriend was raided. Her boyfriend at the time was selling drugs. She was using marijuana at the time and turned a blind eye to whatever her boyfriend was doing. She went through a drug treatment program with the court. She lost her children for a period of time. She went through the process with DCS to get them back. She is not currently on any kind of probation. She went through everything that was asked by both the court system and DCS. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test and upon passage, license be issued free and clear.

#### 30. Louise Mikle LPN Exam Grad date 2009/previous testing attempts

Ms. Mikle appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She graduated in 2009 and has previously tested. She is currently taking an ATI review course. She has not tested since 2012 due to dealing with some very personal issued with her children. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test after providing the board with documentation showing she has at least a 95% chance or greater of passing the NCLEX. ## 33. Jada Johnson RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Johnson appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2006, she was charged with illegal gambling, forgery, and stolen property. All the charges were dropped except forgery. She completed a year of probation. She also received a driving on a suspended license. In February 2015, she was terminated from a QMA position for performing a procedure she was not allowed to do at the facility. She changed a g-tube dressing. She did the procedure but let the nurse sign off on it. She did the procedure because it needed to be done. The facility had a policy in place that QMAs could not do dressing changes. Ms. Blank appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2001, she was convicted of misdemeanor possession of marijuana. In 2008, she was arrested for attempting to steal merchandise from Kmart. She was charged with theft, possession of narcotic, controlled substance, marijuana and paraphernalia. In 2009, she was arrested for attempting to steal merchandise from Kohl's and was charged with possession of paraphernalia and theft. The 2008 and 2009 arrest was combined and she was convicted of misdemeanor theft. Since this time she has turned her life around. She went to rehabilitation for women. She continues to work her recovery and has remained sober. She has taken the NCLEX once but was going through a bad divorce at the time. Ms. Nibarger appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She has taken the NCELX four times. She graduated in 2014. She believes she may have test anxiety. This is the first time she has appeared in front of the board. ALJ Russell recommends the following: She be allowed to test after providing the board with documentation showing she has at least a 95% chance or greater of passing the NCLEX. Her license is to be issued free and clear upon successful passage.
