INFORMATION ABOUT ABSENTEE VOTING FOR MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS

(MOVE Section 580; Indiana Code 3-11-4-5.7(f))Revised October 2018

- 1. You can ask for an absentee ballot by mailing, e-mailing, or faxing a completed Federal Post Card Application (Form 76) to the county election office in the Indiana county where you are registered to vote. If you are not registered to vote, you can also apply to register by using Form 76. The federal form can be found at www.in.gov/sos/elections/2673.htm.
- 2. You can find information about how to contact your county at www.indianavoters.com. Click on "Find Election Administrators."

3.	You can request in your absentee ballot application that a ballot be sent to you by mail, e-mail, or fax.	
4.	The deadline for you to submit your absentee ballot application depends on how you want your absentee ballot to be sent to you: o If you want your absentee ballot sent to you by mail, your county election office must get your application by 11:59 p.m., local prevailing time, eight (8) days before the election (, 201_). o If you want your absentee ballot sent to you by e-mail or fax, your county election office must get your application by Noon, local prevailing time, the day before the election ().	
5.	If you asked on your application that an absentee ballot be sent to you by <i>email</i> , then you county election office will electronically scan a cover sheet (ABS-9) and an absentee ballot Your county will attach the scanned ballot and cover sheet to an email, and send them to you a the email address you put on your absentee ballot application. Print the scanned cover sheet and absentee ballot, complete the cover sheet, and mark the absentee ballot. Take a digital image (photograph) or scan the completed cover sheet and marked absentee ballot and attach the digital image or scan of the documents to an email. Send the email with attached documents to you county at the following address:	
6.	If you asked on your application that an absentee ballot be sent to you by <i>fax</i> , then your count election office will fax a cover sheet (<i>ABS-9</i>) and an absentee ballot to you at the fax number you put on your absentee ballot application. Complete the cover sheet and mark the absentee ballot. Fax the completed cover sheet and absentee ballot to your county at the following address:
