The Commission corrects the following scrivener’s errors in this document:

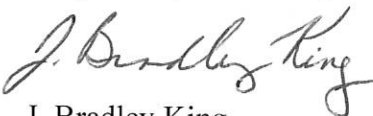

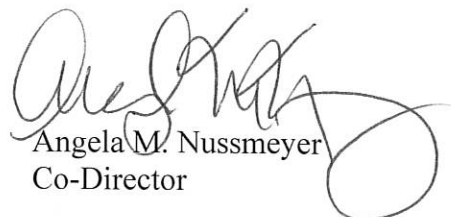

1 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Calling this meeting to
2 order of the Indiana Election Commission. The
3 following Commission members are present: Chairman
4 Paul Okeson, Lauren Ganapini, proxy for Vice
5 Chairman Anthony Long, Member Suzannah Wilson
6 Overholt, Member Zack Klutz.

7 Indiana Election Division staff, Co-director
8 Brad King and Co-director Angie Nussmeyer.
9 Co-general counsels Matthew Kochevar and Dale
10 Simmons. And the court reporter, Beverly Elliott,
11 from Stewart Richardson Deposition Services.

12 I want to remind everyone on behalf of the
13 court reporter when speaking please identify
14 yourself before speaking. Spell your name when
15 identifying yourself and speak clearly and do not
16 speak at the same time as others, please.

17 I request that the co-directors confirm the
18 Commission meeting has happen properly noticed as
19 required under the Open Door Law.

20 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the
21 Commission, on behalf of Co-director Nussmeyer and
22 myself, we confirm that notice of both this public
23 session meeting of the Commission and the previous
24 executive session were given in accordance with the
25 Open Door Law.

1 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Moving on to the agenda, the
2 approval of the October 10th, 2019, Commission
3 minutes and the October 29th, 2019, executive
4 session Commission minutes.

5 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the
6 Commission, the minutes for October 10th, 2019, and
7 the minutes of the executive session conducted on
8 October 29th, 2019, have been reviewed by
9 Co-director Nussmeyer and myself. And we recommend
10 them both to you for your approval.

11 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Is there a motion to approve
12 the minutes as presented?

13 MR. KLUTZ: So moved.

14 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Second?

15 MS. OVERHOLT: Second.

16 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Any discussion?

17 (No response.)

18 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Hearing none, all those in
19 favor say "aye."

20 THE COMMISSION: Aye.

21 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Those opposed.

22 (No response.)

23 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Having none, the ayes have
24 it. The minutes and the motion to approve the
25 minutes are adopted.

1 Want me to go ahead and send this around,
2 Brad?

3 MR. KING: Yes, if you would, please.

4 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Moving on, adoption of
5 Campaign Finance orders, I recognize the
6 co-directors present Campaign Finance enforcement
7 orders prepared for adoption by the Commission.

8 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman and members of the
9 Commission, Miss Taylor and Miss Thompson are here
10 and can speak if there are any questions. Orders
11 have been drafted designated 2019-187 through
12 2019-208 that reflect the determinations made by
13 the Commission at the October 10th, 2019, meeting.
14 These include the assessment of civil penalties,
15 dismissals, and continuances.

16 And we would also request authorization to use
17 the members' signature stamps to process those
18 orders if they're approved.

19 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Okay. Is there a motion to
20 adopt orders 2019-187 through 2019-208 and to
21 authorize the Election Division staff to use our
22 signature stamps to indicate the adoption?

23 MR. KLUTZ: So moved.

24 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Is there a second?

25 MS. OVERHOLT: Second.

1 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Is there any discussion on
2 the matter?

3 (No response.)

4 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Hearing none, all those in
5 favor signify by "aye."

6 THE COMMISSION: Aye.

7 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Those opposed.

8 (No response.)

9 CHAIRMAN OKESON: The ayes have it.

10 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, there were two items
11 that were continued at the last Commission meeting.
12 One was the matter concerning Mr. Fuller's
13 candidate committee. He does not appear to be
14 present. However, we do have a representative
15 present for one other committee. And so if you
16 would proceed, we can bring that matter before the
17 Commission in a presentation by Ms. Taylor and
18 Ms. Thompson.

19 MS. OVERHOLT: Are we going to also adopt our
20 regular roles that we usually adopt?

21 CHAIRMAN OKESON: If necessary. We might not
22 get to that point.

23 MS. OVERHOLT: All right. Just asking.

24 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Everyone who plans to
25 testify at today's meeting on any matter, please

1 stand and recognize the administration of the oath
2 by Mr. Dale Simmons.

3 MR. SIMMONS: Will you raise your right hand.
4 Say "I do" after the administration of the oath.
5 Do you solemnly swear or affirm under the penalties
6 of perjury the testimony you're about to give the
7 Commission is the truth, and whole truth, and
8 nothing but the truth? Say "I do."

9 (Consent by all.)

10 MR. SIMMONS: Thank you.

11 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Before proceeding with
12 Campaign Finance enforcement actions we want to
13 give any committee present the final opportunity to
14 pay reduced civil penalty by waiving the right to
15 present evidence and arguments to the Commission.
16 Any committee is welcome to present evidence and
17 arguments for the proposed penalty to be waived,
18 but this is an opportunity for those who want to
19 waive that presentation and accept a reduced
20 penalty without making any argument or
21 presentation.

22 And I will read off sort of the following
23 arrangements and please ask for someone to move
24 adoption of these. If this is the committee's
25 first violation, the arrangement is for the

1 committee to agree paying 25 percent of the
2 proposed fine plus mailing costs. If this is the
3 committee's second violation, the arrangement is
4 for the committee to agree to pay 50 percent of the
5 proposed fine plus mailing costs.

6 If this is the committee's third violation,
7 the committee would agree to pay 75 percent of the
8 proposed fine plus mailing costs. For purposes of
9 this arrangement a previous settlement agreement
10 entered into by the committee will be counted as
11 one violation. Likewise, if more than one alleged
12 violation occurred on the same calendar day, that
13 group of violations shall be counted as one
14 violation.

15 Is there a second to this motion?

16 MR. KLUTZ: Second.

17 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Any discussion?

18 (No response.)

19 CHAIRMAN OKESON: No further discussion. All
20 those in favor say "aye."

21 THE COMMISSION: Aye.

22 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Those opposed?

23 (No response)

24 CHAIRMAN OKESON: The ayes have it. Motion is
25 ordered.

1 MS. RABER: I'll take it.

2 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Would you please stand.
3 State your name.

4 MS. RABER: Sherry Raber. Spell it too?

5 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Please.

6 MS. RABER: S-H-E-R-R-Y, last name R-A-B-E-R.

7 CHAIRMAN OKESON: And do we have a cause
8 number?

9 MS. THOMPSON: Mr. Chairman, this is Miami
10 County Republican Central Committee Cause No.
11 2019-6494-162. This is a continuance from the last
12 meeting. They have been before the Board one other
13 time, and the proposed civil penalty is \$1,000.55.

14 CHAIRMAN OKESON: And you said it was the
15 first?

16 MS. THOMPSON: This is their second. They've
17 been before the Board once.

18 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Okay. And did I hear you,
19 ma'am, state that you would accept the penalty as
20 proposed?

21 MS. RABER: Yes.

22 CHAIRMAN OKESON: What was the name of the
23 committee again? Will you read the name of the
24 committee again.

25 MS. THOMPSON: Miami County Republican Central

1 Committee.

2 CHAIRMAN OKESON: So the chair recognizes
3 they've accepted the penalty?

4 MS. THOMPSON: I'm sorry. Say again.

5 CHAIRMAN OKESON: The chair recognizes that
6 the committee has accepted the penalty?

7 MS. RABER: Yes, sir.

8 MS. OVERHOLT: At 50 percent; right?

9 MS. RABER: Yes.

10 CHAIRMAN OKESON: At 50 percent plus mailing
11 costs.

12 Thank you. No further business.

13 MS. NUSSMEYER: Mr. Chairman, if I might.

14 Miss Thompson, we did not receive any request
15 from Maurice Fuller or any information from him at
16 all?

17 MS. THOMPSON: Correct. We did not hear from
18 him.

19 MS. NUSSMEYER: Okay. Thank you.

20 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Would the Campaign Finance
21 staff identify any matters for which a motion for
22 continuance was received before today's meeting.

23 MS. THOMPSON: No.

24 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Hearing none, we move to
25 default.

1 Is anyone present to testify on any remaining
2 Campaign Finance hearings scheduled for today?

3 (No response.)

4 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Seeing none, I declare all
5 the hearings on all remaining Campaign Finance
6 matters scheduled for today closed.

7 Is there a motion to impose the entire amount
8 of proposed penalty plus mailing costs in all
9 remaining Campaign Finance enforcement actions?

10 MR. KLUTZ: So moved.

11 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Is there a second?

12 MS. OVERHOLT: Second.

13 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Any discussion?

14 (No response)

15 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Hearing none, all those in
16 favor say "aye."

17 THE COMMISSION: Aye.

18 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Those opposed.

19 (No response.)

20 CHAIRMAN OKESON: The ayes have it.

21 Moving on to administrative complaint, for the
22 record, a Complaint has been filed with the Indiana
23 Civil Rights Commission against the Indiana
24 Election Commission. A copy of the Complaint and
25 the following documents are included in the

1 Commission Members' binders: 1. Documents related
2 to the service of the Complaint; 2. Proposed answer
3 to the Complaint; and 3. A proposed motion to
4 dismiss.

5 I will recognize members for the discussion of
6 the proposed answer motion. So we don't have any.
7 So we need to form a motion.

8 MS. OVERHOLT: Is that where we are now, for a
9 motion to be made?

10 I would move that we request that the Office
11 of the Indiana Attorney General represent the
12 Election Commission with respect to the defense of
13 this Complaint and authorize that office, upon
14 their hopeful acceptance of representation,
15 authorize that office to take all appropriate
16 action to respond to defend against the Complaint
17 with the first step to be asking for additional
18 time to file the response, to prepare and file the
19 response on behalf of the Commission.

20 MR. KLUTZ: I'll second the motion.

21 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Is there any discussion?

22 (No response.)

23 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Hearing none, all those in
24 favor of the motion signify by saying "aye."

25 THE COMMISSION: Aye.

1 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Those opposed.

2 (No response)

3 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Hearing none, the motion
4 carries.

5 Anything else on that front?

6 MR. SIMMONS: No.

7 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Move for adjournment. We
8 have finished our business for today. Is there a
9 motion for the Indiana Election Commission to
10 adjourn?

11 MR. KLUTZ: So moved.

12 MS. OVERHOLT: So moved.

13 CHAIRMAN OKESON: All those in favor say
14 "aye."

15 THE COMMISSION: Aye.

16 CHAIRMAN OKESON: We're adjourned.

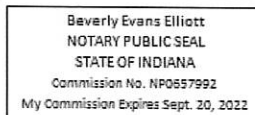

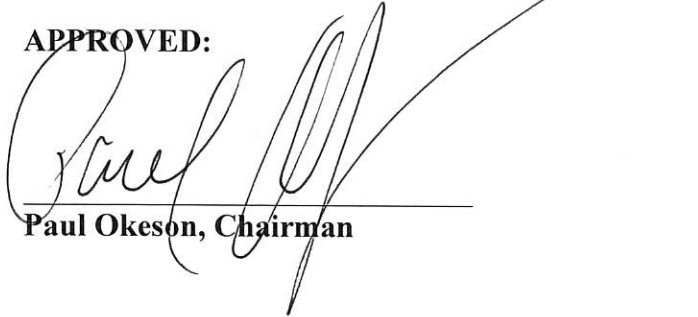
