5	present today. Chairman, myself, Bryce Bennett;
6	Adam Dickey, proxy for Vice President Anthony Long;
7	Member Suzannah Wilson Overholt, and Member
8	Zachary Klutz.
9	The Indiana Election Division Staff consists of
10	our co-directors, Trent Deckard and Brad King, and
11	co-general counsels, Leslie Barnes and Dale Simmons.
12	Our court reporter today is Jenny Reeve from
13	Connor & Associates.
14	Before we begin today's meeting, I want to
15	remind everyone on behalf of the court reporter to
16	identify yourself when you begin to speak, spell
17	your name clearly when you identify yourself, speak
18	clearly, and do not speak at the same time as
19	others.
20	The documentation of compliance with the Open
21	Door Law is appropriate at this point.
22	Mr. Deckard and Mr. King?
23	MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
24	Commission, this meeting of the Indiana Election
25	Commission was properly noticed in compliance with

- 1 the Open Door Law.
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: At this time we would ask
- 3 for a ratification of Campaign Finance Settlement
- 4 Agreements as presented by Ms. Taylor and
- 5 Ms. Thompson.
- 6 MS. THOMPSON: Mr. Chairman, this is the list
- 7 of committees that have agreed to pay the settlement
- 8 agreement and waive the hearing.
- 9 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And these are located in our
- 10 binders?
- 11 MS. THOMPSON: Yes.
- 12 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. Is there a motion to
- 13 ratify the Campaign Settlement Agreements as
- 14 presented?
- 15 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So move.
- 16 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion. Is there
- 17 a second?
- 18 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Second.
- 19 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion and a
- 20 second. Is there any discussion?
- 21 (No response.)
- 22 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, all in favor
- 23 say aye.
- THE COMMISSION: Aye.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, the same sign.

- 1 (No response. Motion carried.)
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried. Thank you.
- 3 The next item of business is campaign finance
- 4 referrals to the attorney general for collection.
- 5 I understand there are referrals of committees to
- 6 the Indiana attorney general for collection of
- 7 fines, and that the Campaign Finance Staff can
- 8 provide information regarding those referrals.
- 9 I would ask for a presentation from the staff
- 10 on this issue.
- MS. THOMPSON: Mr. Chairman, this is a list of
- 12 the committees that we are planning to turn over to
- 13 the AG's office for collection at this time.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: It's my understanding that
- 15 no further commission action is necessary, and these
- 16 referrals will be made. Thank you.
- 17 At this point we would like to administer the
- 18 oath to individuals testifying before the
- 19 Commission. Everyone present who plans to testify
- 20 today regarding any matter coming before the
- 21 Commission today, including campaign finance or
- 22 voting system matters, please stand for the
- 23 administration of the oath.
- I will recognize Dale Simmons to administer the
- 25 oath.



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	1	MR. SIMMONS: Raise your right hand, and say,	
	2	"I do," after the administration of the oath.	
	3	(At this time, the oath is administered.)	
	4	MR. SIMMONS: Thank you.	
	5	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you. Before	
 	6	proceeding with enforcement actions, we want to give	
	7	any committee present a final opportunity to pay a	
	8	reduced civil penalty by waiving the right to	
	9	present evidence and arguments to the Commission.	
	10	Any committee is welcome to present evidence	
	11	and arguments for the proposed penalty to be waived,	
	12	but this is an opportunity for those who want to	
	13	waive that presentation and accept a reduced penalty	
	14	without making any arguments for presentation. And	
	15	you will be free to leave after you do so.	
	16	The arrangements are the following: If this is	
	17	the committee's first violation, the arrangement is	
	18	for the committee to agree to pay 25 percent of the	
	19	proposed fine, plus mailing costs.	
	20	If this is the committee's second violation,	
	21	the arrangement is for the committee to agree to	
	22	pay 50 percent of the proposed fine, plus mailing	
	23	costs.	
	24	If this is the committee's third violation, the	
	25	committee would agree to pay 75 percent of the

1	proposed violation, plus malling costs.
2	Is there a motion from the Commission to
3	approve this arrangement?
4	VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: So moved.
5	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion. Is there
6	a second?
7	MR. KING: Second.
8	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: The motion is seconded. Is
9	there any discussion?
10	(No response.)
11	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: There being no further
12	discussion, all in favor say aye.
13	THE COMMISSION: Aye.
14	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
15	(No response. Motion carried.)
16	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried. The
17	procedure's adopted.
18	Are there any committees here today who would
19	like to accept this arrangement? If so, come
20	forward. Let's start with the closest ones to the
21	front who are willing to accept this arrangement.
22	Yes, come have a seat at the table there.
23	We'll start at the front and work our way back.
24	When you get comfortable, state your name, the
25	committee's name, and the cause number. Indicate
1	

- 1 that you are willing to accept the applicable
- 2 penalty without further discussion.
- MR. MANNWEILER: My name is Paul Mannweiler,
- 4 M-A-N-N-W-E-I-L-E-R, with Bose McKinney & Evans. I
- 5 represent FCCI Services, Inc. And I don't know if I
- 6 have the cause number.
- 7 MS. THOMPSON: I've got it for you.
- 8 Mr. Chairman, that would be on your blue tab.
- 9 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Very well.
- 10 MR. MANNWEILER: To the best of my knowledge,
- 11 this is a first offense. We self-discovered it and
- 12 corrected it, and then heard from the Commission
- 13 about the violation.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And you do accept the
- 15 25 percent penalty, plus mailing costs?
- 16 MR. MANNWEILER: Yes.
- 17 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Very well. That is
- 18 approved, and you're free to go.
- 19 MR. MANNWEILER: Thank you.
- 20 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you.
- MR. MANNWEILER: And I will get a tab from the
- 22 Commission?
- 23 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Excuse me. I have
- 24 a question.
- So in terms of the parameters you laid out for



- 1 these settlements, this is an excess corporation
- 2 issue, as opposed to --
- 3 MS. BARNES: And not a delinquent.
- 4 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Yeah. It's not a
- 5 delinquent?
- 6 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Are you proposing a
- 7 different arrangement?
- 8 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, I guess I'm
- 9 just wondering. I don't think that the procedures
- 10 you mentioned earlier necessarily applied to these
- 11 with the motion that was made previously.
- 12 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Do you have a motion to
- 13 make?
- 14 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I think we just
- 15 need to clarify. I mean I guess we could just make
- 16 a new motion and amend the previous motion,
- 17 whatever, but to clarify that we are willing to have
- 18 the same parameters apply.
- 19 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is that a motion to that
- 20 effect?
- 21 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Sure. Yes, that
- 22 is a motion to that effect.
- 23 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: So we have a motion for the
- 24 parameters that we have laid out here for accepting
- 25 the penalty to apply to excess corporations. Is



1	there a second?	
2	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: I'll second that.	
3	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: The motion is seconded.	
4	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: And before the	
5	vote, I guess I would ask staff, are there other	
6	categories in here? So that we don't keep having to	
7	make motions and clarify what we're doing. Should	
8	that, then, cover all of the categories before us?	
9	MS. BARNES: Mr. Chairman, and Commissioner	
10	Overholt, I'm not certain if it will cover all the	
11	situations before the Commission. I think	
12	Ms. Thompson and Ms. Taylor might be able to tell	
13	us.	
14	There are a variety of penalties other than	
15	delinquent and excessive corporate contributions.	
16	I don't know if we have those before us.	
17	I mean Title 3-9 has a variety of penalties.	
18	MS. THOMPSON: No, not today. Just delinquent	
19	and the excess corporations.	
20	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay, all right.	
21	MS. BARNES: Thanks.	
22	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any further discussion?	
23	(No response.)	
24	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, we have a	
25	motion and a second. All in favor say aye.

- 15 called, the hearing will begin with recognizing
- 16 Campaign Finance Staff to provide information about
- 17 the documents in this matter provided to the
- 18 Commission members, including letters from
- 19 committees and the notice given to the campaign
- 20 committee.
- 21 (B) Unless there is objection, the documents
- 22 provided to the Commission by the Election Division
- 23 will be entered into the record of this meeting.
- 24 (C) After Campaign Finance Staff completes
- 25 presentation, a representative of the committee will



- 1 be recognized first and may present their case for
- 2 no more than five minutes.
- 3 (D) Commission members may ask questions
- 4 during a presentation, but the time spent answering
- 5 these questions will not be counted against the
- 6 presenter's time. The Election Division may signal
- 7 the chair when a presenter's time is up. If the
- 8 presenter offers additional documents or other
- 9 physical evidence not previously received by the
- 10 Commission, then the original must be provided to
- 11 the Election Division to preserve for the record.
- 12 (E) If the Commission finds that a committee
- 13 has violated the campaign finance statutes, state
- 14 law requires a unanimous vote of all four
- 15 commissioners to waive or reduce the amount of the
- 16 penalty set by law.
- 17 (F) If the Commission makes a decision at this
- 18 meeting to either fine a committee or dismiss the
- 19 case against the committee, then the Election
- 20 Division will prepare a final order for the
- 21 Commission to approve at a later meeting.
- 22 (G) If a committee is fined today, the
- 23 committee will receive a notice from the Election
- 24 Division to pay their fine after the Commission
- 25 adopts the final order. So it may be sometime after



1	today before a committee will be required to pay the
2	fine.
3	(H) The Commission generally begins at the
4	front of the room and asks those persons present to
5	come forward to have their matter heard. It's very
6	helpful if you can speak up and say the cause number
7	on your hearing material so that the Commission and
8	staff can quickly look it up on the spreadsheet.
9	Remember to identify yourself when you start
10	speaking.
11	Is there a second to this motion?
12	VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Second.
13	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion and a
14	second. Any discussion on the procedures?
15	(No response.)
16	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, all in favor
17	say aye.
18	THE COMMISSION: Aye.
19	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
20	(No response. Motion carried.)
21	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried, and we have

- 4 and I seek waiver of the penalty.
- 5 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: If you would, spell your
- 6 name, please.
- 7 MR. HADLEY: David, D-A-V-I-D, Hadley,
- 8 H-A-D-L-E-Y.
- 9 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We need to hear from the
- 10 staff.
- MS. THOMPSON: It's page 78.
- 12 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Page 78?
- MS. THOMPSON: Yes.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All right. The staff will
- 15 proceed first, then.
- 16 MS. THOMPSON: This is the Montgomery County
- 17 Democratic Central Committee. The cause number is
- 18 2014-5519-102.
- 19 This committee has not been before the
- 20 Commission before, and has a proposed civil penalty
- 21 of \$200.49.
- MR. HADLEY: I do have a written submission
- 23 that I have four copies of.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Well, I've only got three
- 25 copies here.



- 1 MR. HADLEY: Well, I gave one to the staff.
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All right. You may present.
- 3 MR. HADLEY: As chairman of the Montgomery
- 4 County Democratic Central Committee, I did submit
- 5 the required CFA4 form at 8:30 a.m. on April 21,
- 6 2014, the date on which the form was due.
- 7 I submitted it to Jennifer Bentley, the
- 8 Montgomery County Clerk and chairwoman of the County
- 9 Election Board. I have a time-stamped copy of the
- 10 form submitted to Ms. Bentley.
- In submitting it to the election board, I
- 12 believed that we were complying with the
- 13 requirements outlined in the 2014 Indiana Campaign
- 14 Finance Manual published by the Election Commission.
- And I quote the relevant passage on page 50,
- 16 which reads, in part, that, "This report must be
- 17 filed with the Election Commission or appropriate
- 18 County Election Board by noon seven days before,"
- 19 yada, yada, yada. And that's what I did. I
- 20 interpreted that to mean it could be filed either
- 21 with the Election Division or the County Election
- 22 Board.
- We were in the middle of selecting the new
- 24 treasurer, which we accomplished the day the report
- 25 was due. And I was prepared to -- on the 21st of



- 1 April, to take the form in person to the -- to bring
- 2 it to the Election Commission.
- 3 But I believe that the Campaign Finance Manual
- 4 gave us the opportunity to file it at the
- 5 election -- County Election Board.
- 6 Indeed, when I went to the County Election
- 7 Board on -- or to the county clerk on -- at 8:30 in
- 8 the morning on the 21st, I said, "Here's the deal.
- 9 It says that I can file it with the Election Board
- 10 and county or the State Election Commission. Am I
- 11 correct?"
- And she said, "Yes. You can file it with us,"
- 13 the Republicans did.
- 14 So anyway, I thought I was complying with the
- 15 campaign finance requirements.
- 16 I was completely prepared at 8:30 on that
- 17 Monday morning to drive to Indianapolis to file the
- 18 report in person. But receiving some validation of
- 19 my interpretation from the county clerk, I thought,
- 20 "Okay, I'm done here." And I thought I had
- 21 complied.
- 22 As soon as we found out that the Election
- 23 Commission didn't believe, or had a different
- 24 interpretation, I submitted it electronically as
- 25 soon as I could, stopping the clock.



- 1 So thought I'd complied. Didn't. It won't
- 2 happen again. But we would like it to be waived.
- 3 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any response by the
- 4 Commission or Campaign Finance Staff.
- 5 MS. THOMPSON: Pardon me.
- 6 MS. TAYLOR: She wants to check.
- 7 MR. HADLEY: My recollection -- while she's
- 8 looking for that, my recollection is that I found
- 9 out about our delinquency by a second party. And I
- 10 then called the Election Division and was told,
- 11 indeed, I had to file. And as soon as I got that
- 12 word, I did email the documents.
- 13 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Mr. Chairman,
- 14 I would move to go ahead and waive the fine in light
- of the fact that they did attempt to file. This is
- 16 the first violation.

- 9 MR. JOHN: Tom John, Ice Miller, appearing on
- 10 behalf of WellPoint, Inc., along with the senior
- 11 director of public affairs, John Willey.
- MR. WILLEY: W-I-L-E-Y.
- MS. THOMPSON: It's at your blue tab.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: I think we know how to spell
- 15 your name.
- 16 MS. THOMPSON: This is WellPoint, Incorporated,
- 17 Cause No. 14-126. Contributed to the Senate
- 18 Majority Campaign Committee in the amount of \$4,000.
- 19 This committee has never been before the
- 20 Commission. And also, the Senate Majority Campaign
- 21 Committee refunded \$2,000 back to WellPoint.
- 22 And this proposed civil penalty is three times
- 23 the excess amount.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anything else?
- MS. THOMPSON: That's it.



1	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Mr. John?
2	MR. JOHN: So we are here seeking a dismissal
3	of this action. In fact, what we have here is a
4	company that is very careful to follow the campaign
5	finance laws. In fact, as we go through the facts
6	of this, you'll find that this is exactly how the
7	system is supposed to operate.
8	We have a self-reporting system in our campaign
9	finance laws where you have the ability to go back
10	and to actually change your reports to ensure that
11	the top goal of all the campaign finance reporting
12	is, in fact, transparency to the voters and
13	transparency to the public, not just to ensure
14	whether people check the box, so to speak, or not.
15	In this case we have a client that what
16	happened is, in January of 2013, there was a
17	2,000-dollar check that was cut. Specifically, that
18	was on the 4th of January, 2013. That was cut to
19	the senate committee.
20	It was entered into a database that WellPoint
21	has that tracks all of their corporate
22	contributions. It was inadvertently omitted from a
23	database that was used to track the aggregate
24	corporate limits to make sure that we were in
25	compliance with that.

- 1 Then in August, another 2,000-dollar check was 2 cut. That was August 12, 2013. It was once again
- 3 entered in the first system. The second system did
- 4 not pick it up because there had been the oversight
- 5 of it not being put into the second system to track
- 6 the aggregate limits.
- 7 The mistake was identified through a regular
- 8 company audit by WellPoint to go through its system
- 9 to ensure that they're actually complying with the
- 10 finance laws.
- 11 The refund was requested from the Senate
- 12 Majority Committee. That \$2,000 was refunded to
- 13 the -- from the Senate Majority Committee to
- 14 WellPoint on November 7 of 2013.
- So we've had a system where, with no
- 16 intervention from the Commission or from the
- 17 Division, we've got a corporate citizen who's gone
- 18 through, policed itself. Yes, it had one fault
- 19 that -- you know, somebody made a mistake. That
- 20 happens. But it was caught due to the redundancies
- 21 in the process.
- Then, since that time, you have a system that
- 23 already had multiple layers of review that has
- 24 various reviews from director, senior director,
- 25 senior VP, of where money is going, and when it's

1	going.
2	But since that time, they've newly added, in
3	order to avoid a future problem like this, Democracy
4	Data & Communications is a vendor which is a
5	political compliance vendor. So they will actually
6	be furthermore a live system that will check and
7	hopefully ensure that this never happens again.
8	So in this case we're dealing with, based on
9	past practices, my understanding of the Commission,
10	where you have self-identification, you refund the
11	money, you have remedial measures, it's the ideal
12	situation for a dismissal.
13	We could answer any questions you have.
14	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any questions?
15	(No response.)
.16	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, is there a
17	motion from the Commission?
18	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Mr. Chairman, the
19	mitigating factors appear to be, according to the
20	testimony, that there was a self-reporting internal
21	audit, return of the contribution, and no prior
22	actions by this by our commission against this
23	committee. I would move that the fine be dismissed.
24	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second?
25	I'll second the motion. Discussion?

- 1 (No response.)
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, all in favor
- 3 say aye.
- 4 THE COMMISSION: Aye.

- MS. THOMPSON: Okay. We'll get that.
- MS. GOLDEN: So I apologize. I don't have
- 17 that.
- MS. THOMPSON: We'll give it to you.
- MS. TAYLOR: This is on page 87.
- 20 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you. The staff may
- 21 provide their report.
- MS. THOMPSON: This is Richard Mourdock for
- 23 State Treasurer. It's Cause No. 2014-4677-121.
- 24 This committee has never been before the
- 25 Commission before. Has a proposed civil penalty of



- \$900.49. 1 MS. GOLDEN: Thank you for letting us be here 2 3 today. As I said, my name is Jodi. We're asking to waive the penalties, if at all possible. We've never been here before. I know that as soon as the committee staff was made aware of the 7 oversight, we filed a report as soon as we could. 8 Part of the oversight was a misunderstanding 9 with the Campaign Finance Manual. The language in 10 it on page 8 with the chart does state that, 11 "Statewide candidates on the 2014 election ballot." 12 Richard Mourdock is legally ineligible to appear on 13 the ballot, so we assumed that we did not have to 14 file a quarterly report since we are not technically 15 on the ballot. So that was our oversight. 16 Our total liabilities actually exceed what we 17
 - 18 have in the account. And there was little activity
 - 19 in the account, so there was not a lot of public --
 - 20 as far as not disclosing the activity.
 - 21 And finally, obviously, the treasurer is no
 - 22 longer in office, so we plan to disband the
 - 23 committee as soon as possible.
 - 24 So we'd appreciate your consideration.
 - 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Would you spell your last



- 1 name, Jodi?
- 2 MS. GOLDEN: Yes. G-O-L-D-E-N.
- 3 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any response from the staff?
- 4 MS. THOMPSON: No.
- 5 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any questions from the
- 6 commissioners?
- 7 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I'd just like some

- MS. GOLDEN: Yes. And we did file as soon as,
- 19 like I said, we were made aware of the oversight.
- 20 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I just have a
- 21 question for the staff. How late was the report?
- 22 It was filed on May 2, I guess?
- MS. TAYLOR: April 15.
- 24 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: April 15.
- MS. GOLDEN: And part of that is, the mail goes



- 1 to a P.O. Box which is down in Evansville where the
- 2 treasurer lives. So by the time staff got it, there
- 3 was a delay. And so we apologize for that delay.
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any other questions?
- 5 (No response.)
- 6 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a motion?
- 7 I had a question about the filing requirements
- 8 in this situation that perhaps counsel could help
- 9 with. Is it necessary to provide it if the
- 10 candidate is not eligible for the election?
- 11 MR. SIMMONS: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 12 Commission, what the requirement is key to in this
- 13 case, 3-9-5-6, is whether or not the office is up on
- 14 the ballot, not whether the candidate himself or
- 15 herself is on the ballot. It has to do with whether
- 16 that office is on the ballot.
- So there may be folks with statewide committees
- open where they're not on the ballot, but the office
- 19 is up, that still have to comply with that filing
- 20 requirement, that quarterly filing requirement.
- 21 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you. Leslie, do you
- 22 concur with that assessment?
- MS. BARNES: Can I have about another 30
- 24 seconds, Mr. Chairman?
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Absolutely.



- 1 MS. BARNES: Thank you.
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And maybe I'll ask a
- 3 question in the meantime.

	16	\$1,000.49, and the report is not filed at this time.
:	17	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Very well. Mr. Keltner?
	18	MR. KELTNER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I was
	19	first notified that there was a concern with my
	20	committee on January 14, which was a Tuesday, of
	21	this year. I was told by an acquaintance, Dan
	22	Drexler, to get ahold of either Abbey Taylor or
	23	Michelle Thompson, who I believe you folks might be.

At that time I was informed that this had

And I believe I spoke with Michelle.

- 1 actually occurred three times in the past. And
- 2 Mr. Drexler asked me if I was aware that I still had
- 3 a committee open. I said, no, I was not aware of
- 4 that, because initially I was told it would probably
- 5 be administratively resolved, and there was no more
- 6 action.
- 7 However, they also informed me at that time
- 8 that there was money in the account, and because of
- 9 that it could not be administratively resolved.
- I have not been trying to be recalcitrant. I
- 11 mean not to cause you any extra work. The fact is
- 12 that when I talked to I believe Michelle, I was
- 13 informed that the committee -- the -- the
- 14 appropriate information of these problems was being
- 15 sent to the committee at 4940 Haynes Avenue, which,
- 16 on the CFA1 form, that was 2006 August, that was the
- 17 correct committee address.
- 18 However, on August 2000 -- I'm sorry -- April
- 19 of 2008, the committee changed their address to my
- 20 personal home address of 7527 Cape Cod Lane. That
- 21 information, then, would have been sent to the wrong
- 22 address per the CFA1 form, which is why I did not
- 23 receive that information.
- I would -- I do not relish being in
- 25 noncompliance with any law. I hold one speeding

- 1 ticket in my entire life. And frankly, it's very
- 2 unnerving to me that this happened. And I'm here to
- 3 make sure that I have a clear expectation of what
- 4 needs to be done.
- 5 I would have disbanded this years ago had I
- 6 thought this was still going on. And it is my fault
- 7 that it still is, obviously, and I take full
- 8 responsibility for it.
- 9 But I'm hoping that you might -- and I have
- 10 these for you to look at just to prove what I'm --
- 11 my point. I'm sorry I didn't realize there would be
- 12 so many of you here or I would have made an
- 13 appropriate number of copies.
- 14 At the time when I called -- and I did receive
- 15 the proposal of settlement. And at that time I had
- 16 called back and said do I just file my CF -- the
- 17 appropriate file -- the appropriate paperwork that
- 18 was missing at that time, because I had to prove
- 19 that the money was taken out of the account and that
- 20 it has a zero balance.
- 21 At that time it was recommended, since it had
- 22 already been turned over to the secretary of state,
- 23 that I just come to this meeting and discuss with
- 24 you the appropriate way to close this account, file
- 25 the final paperwork, and make sure that the account



- 1 was closed and that the committee was closed.
- 2 And I had talked to my treasurer. In the
- 3 settlement it had, under -- line number three said
- 4 that the treasurer of the committee was notified by
- 5 the division. And she happens to be my accountant.
- 6 And I spoke with her, and she said she had not
- 7 received anything either.
- 8 So I believe that the problem was it just got
- 9 sent to the original CFA1 form that I was -- as
- 10 discussed on the phone originally, not to the -- the
- 11 refile a year and a half later.
- 12 And therefore, I believe I'm asking for a
- 13 waiver of the damages.
- I would have pounced on this with alacrity at
- 15 an earlier date had I known that this was still
- 16 going on. But it is my oversight, and I do realize
- 17 that there were costs associated with that for the
- 18 committee in mailings and things.
- So I realize that some settlement -- a complete
- 20 zero balance may not be reasonable, but some reduced
- 21 balance.
- 22 My goal -- as I understand, I can zero the
- 23 balance out and donate that money to a charity, and
- 24 then just show that it was zeroed by stapling the
- 25 account number and that printout to the CFA form to



- prove that it's been balance -- zeroed out.
- 2 And I did check, if it matters. As of this
- 3 morning there's \$1,656.96 in that account that I
- 4 will -- my plan is to donate that to charity, and
- 5 then close this account at your pleasure, however
- 6 time frame you see fit, to make sure that this is
- 7 dealt with appropriately.
- 8 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anything further from the
- 9 Campaign Finance Staff?
- 10 MS. THOMPSON: No.
- 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any questions from the
- 12 commissioners?
- 13 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Yes, I have a
- 14 couple of questions.
- 15 So I guess this is for staff. These prior
- 16 delinquencies, these prior years, have there been
- 17 hearings for these?
- 18 MS. THOMPSON: Yes.
- 19 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: And has
- 20 Mr. Keltner or someone from his committee appeared
- 21 before?
- MS. THOMPSON: No.
- 23 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay. Have any of
- 24 these reports actually been filed?
- MS. THOMPSON: I don't think so.



1	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: And white you're
2	looking for the file, I guess my other question
3	would be do we know or what to which address
4	have notices of these hearings been sent?
5	MS. THOMPSON: The last report was filed
6	January 19 of 2011, and that
7	MS. TAYLOR: That was the 2010 annual report.
8	MS. THOMPSON: Yeah. And that was sent to the
9	Haynes Avenue. That has the 4940 Haynes Avenue
10	address on here.
11	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: And then the
12	MS. THOMPSON: But nothing since that report.
13	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay. I'm sorry.
1.4	So the 2010 report that was filed in 2011 had the
15	Haynes Avenue address? Is that what you just said?
16	I'm sorry.
17	MS. THOMPSON: Yeah.
18	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: What address was the 2012
19	and 2013 sent to? Is it the same address?
20	MS. THOMPSON: I have the same address on
21	everything, the Haynes address. All the delinquency
22	notices and everything have that Haynes address.
23	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: What's the effect of
24	this? I mean what is this the proper notice of
25	address change?

- MS. THOMPSON: Yeah. And he can do it on --
- 2 report on the 4 and the 1. Let me see if he did it
- 3 on that one.
- 4 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Does this filing
- 5 constitute a change of address to Cape Cod Lane
- 6 effective -- the filing date is April 2008?
- 7 MS. THOMPSON: Well, he changed it to the
- 8 Haynes address -- let's see. In 2008 I still have
- 9 the Haynes address.
- 10 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I guess the CFA1,
- 11 section B, asks for -- line 14 asks for the mailing
- 12 address of the committee, and line 22 asks for the
- 13 mailing address of the chair.
- 14 And I guess my question would be which address
- 15 does the Election Division consider the official
- 16 address? Because these are two different addresses.
- MS. TAYLOR: The committee address would be the
- one that our online system generates labels to for
- 19 anything.
- 20 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Appears the box is
- 21 checked that this is a new address.
- MS. THOMPSON: In 2008 he has the Cape Cod, but
- 23 all the rest of the reports following that have the
- 24 Haynes address.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a motion? Any



- 1 other questions?
- 2 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, so he's
- 3 filed reports other than the -- the annual reports
- 4 are the ones that have been delinquent, but he's
- 5 filed the other reports, then?
- 6 MS. THOMPSON: Right. The annual reports of
- 7 every year, because he wasn't on the ballot,
- 8 obviously. He just has an annual report due.
- 9 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I thought you said
- 10 that the last report that was filed was the 2010
- 11 annual report that would have been filed in 2011.
- MS. TAYLOR: That's correct. He has not filed
- 13 the 2011, '12, or '13 annual reports.
- 14 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: And the 2010
- 15 report that he filed had the Haynes Avenue address?
- 16 MS. THOMPSON: Yes.
- 17 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay.
- MS. THOMPSON: Do you want to see it?
- 19 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Yes, please. I'm
- 20 sorry. I'm not trying to be ...
- MS. THOMPSON: That's okay.
- 22 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I guess I have
- 23 another question. So can the money in the account
- 24 be used to pay fines? I should know the answer to
- 25 that.



1 MS.	BARNES:	Yes.
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- 2 MR. DECKARD: Yes.
- 3 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: It's unusual
- 4 that we have a candidate, someone with sufficient
- 5 money in their account to cover the fine. That
- 6 usually doesn't happen.
- 7 MR. KELTNER: It was actually odd to me. I
- 8 didn't realize there was money in the account,
- 9 but -- which, as I said, wasn't -- would have --
- 10 kinda was the problem, that there was money in the
- 11 account.
- 12 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any motions?
- I guess I would move that we continue this
- 14 hearing, with the instructions that all past due
- 15 reports be filed. And if that is accomplished and
- 16 the campaign is closed, we can evaluate the
- 17 situation at the next hearing that we have, take the
- 18 matter up at that time.
- 19 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: I would second that.
- 20 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any discussion?
- 21 (No response.)
- 22 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All in favor say aye.
- THE COMMISSION: Aye.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
- 25 (No response. Motion carried.)



- 1 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: The ayes have it.
- 2 So you understand we're giving you the
- 3 opportunity to submit all the past due reports and
- 4 close out the campaign by the next hearing?
- 5 MR. KELTNER: Yes.
- 6 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And we'll address the matter
- 7 at that time.
- 8 MR. KELTNER: Thank you. For clarification,
- 9 just so I'm clear, is that next meeting, I mean is
- 10 that next week, or what's the time frame on that?
- 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: No date has been set.
- 12 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Just for our
- 13 clarification, what address do you want the notice
- 14 of the meeting sent?
- MR. KELTNER: The one you sent the last one.
- MS. THOMPSON: Cape Cod?
- MR. KELTNER: Yeah, the Cape Cod. And will you
- 18 be -- can I get from your office, just for my --
- 19 MS. THOMPSON: You can get with us --
- 20 MR. KELTNER: -- with my treasurer to figure
- 21 out why that didn't happen.
- MS. THOMPSON: Okay.
- MR. KELTNER: Is it just the annual reports
- 24 since --
- 25 MS. TAYLOR: It will be 2011, '12, and '13.



- 1 There are three of them.
- 2 MR. KELTNER: 2011, '12, and 2013, annual.
- 3 MS. TAYLOR: Right.
- 4 MR. KELTNER: And as far as dating those?
- 5 MS. TAYLOR: They're all January 1 through
- 6 December 31 of the previous year, or of that year,
- 7 and January --
- 8 MR. KELTNER: Thank you.
- 9 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Mr. Keltner, we would ask
- 10 that you file an amended CFA1 to show your Cape Cod
- 11 mailing address.
- MR. KELTNER: Oh, that's the original, okay.
- 13 And that's for the -- at 22, line 22, you want that
- 14 to be on there?
- 15 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Yes, the --
- 16 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: -- committee
- 17 information.
- 18 MR. KELTNER: And then go ahead and do the --
- 19 you know, have everything ready so that when I come
- 20 in, I can show that we have zero balance and all
- 21 that for you at that time, or would there be --
- MS. TAYLOR: Do it before then. File it when
- 23 you get it figured out.
- MR. KELTNER: Yeah, yeah.
- MS. TAYLOR: And then we'll bring everything to



- 1 the meeting so you won't need --
- 2 MR. KELTNER: Okay.
- 3 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Yeah. Then --
- 4 MR. KELTNER: Okay.
- 5 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: -- asked if that had all
- 6 been submitted so you'll --
- 7 MR. KELTNER: Okay.
- 8 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: -- have it before the
- 9 meeting.
- 10 MR. KELTNER: I guess, for practicality
- 11 purposes, I'm just trying to make sure that if there
- 12 are fines outstanding, might still have some money
- 13 to use for that. But I'd rather try and use the
- 14 money, like I say, for charity purposes, or some
- 15 other thing. So that was the reason I was having a
- 16 hard time figuring out how to close it out first or
- 17 second.
- MS. THOMPSON: The previous fines that have
- 19 already come before the Commission have already been
- 20 turned over to the attorney general.
- MR. KELTNER: Okay.
- MS. THOMPSON: So it's out of my hands there.
- 23 I don't know.
- MR. KELTNER: All right. Can I just contact
- 25 them to find out on that, or ...



- 1 MS. THOMPSON: I don't know. Why don't you
- 2 check with us. Give us a call tomorrow.
- 3 MR. KELTNER: Okay, that's fine. Thank you.
- 4 I don't mean to take more time. Thank you very
- 5 much. I appreciate the opportunity to rectify the
- 6 situation.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you.
- 8 ****
- 9 MR. HARRIS: Good evening. My name is Jewell,
- 10 J-E-W-E-L-L, last name Harris. And I'm the chairman
- 11 of the JGH Political Action Committee. The
- 12 administrative cause number is 2011-4941-36.
- MS. THOMPSON: Page 7. This is JGH Political
- 14 Action Committee; is that correct?
- MR. HARRIS: Yes.
- 16 MS. THOMPSON: This one has motions to
- 17 reconsider, several. If you'll see, it's also on
- 18 page 8 and page 13, page 15, page 16, 17.
- 19 MS. TAYLOR: 18, 20, 21, 25, 26, and 27.
- 20 MR. DECKARD: Is it also the green tab?
- MS. THOMPSON: I don't think so. If you go to
- 22 the green tab, second page there, it's from -- and
- 23 then it's all the previous reports that she filed
- 24 online.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: From the Campaign Finance



- 1 Staff, any further presentation?
- 2 MS. THOMPSON: Do you want me to read each one
- 3 of these causes individually?
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: I think we need the numbers
- 5 in the record.
- 6 MS. THOMPSON: This is JGH Political Action
- 7 Committee. This is Cause No. 2006-4941-94; Cause
- 8 No. 2009-4941-189; Cause No. 2009-4941-234; Cause
- 9 No. 2010-4941-21; Cause No. 2011-4941-86; Cause
- 10 No. 2011-4941-36; Cause No. 2010-4941-42; Cause
- 11 No. 2012-4941-32; Cause No. 2012-4941-114; Cause
- 12 No. 2011-4941-348; Cause No. 2013-4941-36; Cause
- 13 No. 2013-4941-99; Cause No. 2012-4941-200. And
- 14 that's it.
- 15 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any further recitation with
- 16 regard to his situation, his case?
- MS. THOMPSON: All these reports at this time
- 18 have been filed.
- 19 MS. TAYLOR: And 2014 pre-primary report was
- 20 filed on time.
- 21 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: When were all these
- 22 prior reports filed?
- MS. THOMPSON: December 30 of '13, and
- 24 January 7 of 2014.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Presentation by the



- 1 campaign?
- MR. HARRIS: I take full responsibility that
- 3 the committee did not file when we should have. The
- 4 treasurer moved, and -- to Michigan, but she was
- 5 also under the impression that since there was no
- 6 activity going on, that for some reason, she felt
- 7 she did not need to file and did not inform me that
- 8 she was not filing.
- 9 And so she's no longer -- she moved to
- 10 Michigan. She's no longer there, and I'm trying to
- 11 get it all straightened out the way it is supposed
- 12 to be done.
- I think we've talked back and forth to your
- 14 staff to let you know that yes, we want this cleared
- 15 up and done correctly.
- 16 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is the committee still
- 17 active?
- 18 MR. HARRIS: The committee still intends to be
- 19 active, yes. We have no funds in the account.
- 20 We're not distributing any money.
- 21 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any questions by the
- 22 Commission?
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Notices were
- 24 sent prior, correct?
- MS. THOMPSON: Yes.



- 1 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Did you
- 2 receive those prior notices?
- 3 MR. HARRIS: No. I didn't find out about it
- 4 until I started inquiring about it.
- 5 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Do we know
- 6 where the notices were sent to?
- 7 MS. TAYLOR: They have since updated the
- 8 address. They were going to Lincoln Way in Valpo,
- 9 I believe. It is now going to 706 Roosevelt Street
- 10 in Gary.
- 11 MR. HARRIS: May I ask a question? What's
- 12 Lincoln Way in Valpo?
- MS. TAYLOR: I could be wrong about that. I
- 14 could have it confused with another committee in my
- 15 head.
- 16 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Let's double-check.
- 17 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: While she's
- 18 looking, do you have a treasurer going forward, a
- 19 different treasurer going forward?
- MR. HARRIS: Yes. Lynda Arce, L-Y-N-D-A, last
- 21 name Arce, A-R-C-E.
- 22 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anyone have a motion?
- MS. THOMPSON: The previous address was 13 West
- 24 Sixth Street in Gary?
- MR. HARRIS: Uh-huh.



- 1 MS. THOMPSON: That's where they were being
- 2 sent to.
- 3 MR. HARRIS: I don't know.
- 4 MS. THOMPSON: Since then they've been updated.
- 5 MR. HARRIS: Yes, yes.
- 6 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Is that an
- 7 address that was linked to your organization, or is
- 8 that --
- 9 MR. HARRIS: Yes, yes. We're no longer there.
- 10 But it was a correct address at the time.
- 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a motion?
- 12 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: I'll make a motion.
- 13 I do appreciate the fact that the reports are up to
- 14 date and filed, but it does appear to be a repeated
- 15 failure to comply for multiple years, and intent to
- 16 keep the committee active and open.
- 17 So I would propose that -- and I'm making this
- 18 proposal and this motion based upon all of the
- 19 matters pending -- that a fine be levied of
- 20 10 percent of the collective fine amount, which I
- 21 believe to be around \$11,000, or whatever all the
- 22 cause numbers add up to -- but a fine of 10 percent
- 23 of all pending funds.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second?
- 25 I'll second the motion.



58 Any discussion? We have a motion and second. 1 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, for 2 clarification, I mean flipping through all of this, 3 the total fines in here, the total proposed fines looks to me like it would be in excess of over 5 \$11,000 probably? 6 MS. THOMPSON: Yeah. 7 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay. 10 percent is about \$1,100. CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All in favor of the pending 10 motion say aye. 11 THE COMMISSION: Aye. 12 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign. 13 (No response. - 2 MR. TRACY: My name is Bradley Tracy.
- 3 B-R-A-D-L-E-Y, T-R-A-C-Y, representing Citizens for
- 4 Robert D. Green.
- 5 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Do you know the cause
- 6 number?
- 7 MS. THOMPSON: I have it for you. This is
- 8 Citizens for Robert D. Green. It starts on page 2,
- 9 Mr. Chairman. This is, again, another one of the
- 10 motions to reconsider. So I'll just read you the
- 11 cause numbers, if that's okay.
- 12 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay.
- MS. THOMPSON: Citizens for Robert Green.
- 14 Cause No. 2004-3689-8; Cause No. 2005-3689-30;
- 15 2005-3689-91; 2005-3689-14; 2006-3689-2;
- 16 2007-3689-150; 2009-3689-71; 2008-3689-268;
- 17 2009-3689-269; 2009-3689-270; 2008-3689-278;
- 18 2009-3689-35; 2010-3689-13; 2010-3689-47;
- 19 2010-3689-82; 2012-3689-19; 2011-3689-376;
- 20 2013-3689-28; 2012-3689-225; 2013-3689-120;
- 21 2012-3689-123; 2012-3689-127. That's it.
- 22 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: What is the total amount of
- 23 the fines?
- MS. TAYLOR: They're each a thousand dollars.
- 25 MS. BARNES: Twenty-two. I counted 22.



- 1 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: So \$22,000?
- 2 MS. TAYLOR: That sounds about right.
- 3 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anything else from the
- 4 Campaign Finance Staff regarding these violations?
- 5 MS. THOMPSON: No. They've all been filed at
- 6 this time.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And the campaign has filed a
- 8 motion to reconsider?
- 9 MR. TRACY: Yes, sir. Robert couldn't be here.
- 10 He lives in Florida now. And he contacted me on
- 11 August 15 of 2013, shortly after Mr. King had
- 12 contacted him via the local county commissioner or
- 13 chairman or county council or something finding his
- 14 address, and notifying Robert that his committee had
- 15 been delinquent for 10 years. And then so Robert
- 16 really started making a few phone calls, and called
- 17 me and asked me if I would clean it up.
- To the point that he was so unaware of this,
- 19 we had to spend the first three months going through
- 20 unclaimed property at the attorney general's office
- 21 to reclaim the funds that were even in the account,
- 22 because it was Robert's understanding that in 2003,
- 23 that the committee was going to be resolved --
- 24 dissolved, and all of the funds were going to be
- 25 sent to the state party. Since he was a Republican,



- 1 they were going to send it to the state Republican
- 2 party, since he was leaving the country.
- 3 So he was somewhat surprised and called me. So
- 4 we had to go through the process of reclaiming the
- 5 funds. We had to go through the process of
- 6 reinstating an EIN number in order for us to be able
- 7 to open a checking account to accept the funds to
- 8 disburse the funds to close the account out.
- 9 In the meantime, on the 3rd of October, I made
- 10 the suggestion that I become his treasurer to make
- 11 it simple since I could take care of all of this for
- 12 him. We did that on October 4.
- 13 I was granted access to the online Campaign
- 14 Finance System. And by August 8, I had all the
- 15 campaign reports updated.
- 16 But I will clarify. The funds were not
- 17 available at that time. But since we knew he had
- 18 spent no money, because he didn't even know what
- 19 bank it was in, I had to go through the process of
- 20 finding out what bank it was in to even come up with
- 21 this.
- 22 So the bottom line is, we're up to date. There
- 23 have been some fees involved just for the fact that
- 24 there was time on my part and some other people's
- 25 doing some travel in order to find this.



	1	And it's his intention immediately upon the
	2	decision of the Commission to close this account out
	3	immediately and turn over any leftover funds to the
	4	his original intent, which was to the party.
	5	VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Was he his
	6	own treasurer?
	7	MR. TRACY: No. He had a volunteer treasurer.
	8	And he was living in Florida at the time. And when
ļ	9	he moved to the Arab states to teach the class, he
	10	thought it was being closed out, and the treasurer
	11	just kind of just so there was just this lack of
	12	communication.
	13	And like I said, the funds had been sitting in
	14	the AG's unclaimed property for like eight years.
	15	So I would just ask mercy on the Court, I

- there has been no problems with the process.
- 13 Today I wanted to not dispute what has
- 14 happened, but to appeal for a waiver for several
- 15 different reasons. And I would like to summarize
- 16 those reasons as succinctly as possible.
- The first is that this is a first-time offense.
- 18 It's an unfortunate mistake and oversight on behalf
- 19 of the committee. Throughout 2012, all forms were
- 20 filed properly and on time. There was just a little
- 21 misunderstanding as to, you know, a report being
- 22 filed for 2013, given that it's not an election
- 23 year, really not any political activity.
- But as soon as the mistake was detected, it was
- 25 corrected. And furthermore, I'm not a candidate for



- 1 state office this year, nor do I plan to be a
- 2 candidate for state office in the near future.
- 3 The committee does plan to disband soon. This
- 4 is an election year, and there are probably
- 5 candidates and committees who would love to have a
- 6 drop in the bucket. And so this committee will be
- 7 disbanded. I'm a candidate for township trustee in
- 8 Hancock County.
- 9 And the second reason -- that leads me to the
- 10 second reason -- is that with this campaign that's
- 11 currently being waged now on a local level,
- 12 nonpartisan observers have indicated that it could
- 13 be a tossup. And my opponent would love nothing
- 14 more than to -- since this is public information --
- 15 to use this as a muscling tactic.
- And the voters of McCordsville deserve much
- 17 more than that. They deserve a campaign about the
- 18 issues, about consolidation of prior services, about
- 19 listening to the township board, about improving
- 20 services without raising taxes, about moving this
- 21 township forward as one of the fastest growing
- 22 townships in Indiana. Those are the issues that the
- 23 voters deserve to have a discussion about.
- 24 So I would like to humbly and respectfully
- 25 impress upon the committee that whatever decision is

- 1 made today is not only going to impact this
- 2 committee, but possibly the quality of campaign that
- 3 the voters of Vernon Township will have in the fall.
- The second [sic] reason why I'm requesting a
- 5 waiver is because, as I mentioned, the committee
- 6 will be closed.
- 7 The fourth [sic] reason, and at risk of placing
- 8 my own personal dignity on the line, I am -- I have
- 9 recently been laid off from my position with a media
- 10 firm. It's been a tough time, as many of us know,
- 11 for the print media industry. And given that I'm
- 12 not a candidate for office, and given that those
- 13 involved with the committee are no longer working
- 14 with the committee in a practical sense, probably
- not too many people who will donate to a campaign
- 16 just to -- or a committee -- to pay a levy issued by
- 17 the state. So that will come -- that levy will
- 18 probably come out of pocket. And at this time, that
- 19 would not be a possibility in an immediate sense.
- But I do have documentation with the state of
- 21 Indiana, Indiana Department of Workforce

- 17 MR. SIMMONS: A contribution is considered
- 18 received under a statute 3-9-1-25, and I think, in
- 19 this case, subsection (b), is when it's received and
- 20 deposited. So it takes both the receipt and deposit
- 21 into the account.
- Up to that time, of course, the recipient has
- 23 the opportunity to return the contribution and not
- 24 have to report it. But if it's received, and once
- 25 it's deposited, that's when it's considered received



- 1 by the committee.
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Received, and money's in the
- 3 bank.
- 4 MR. SIMMONS: Money's in the bank.
- 5 MR. VOGT: I do have a copy of that receipt.
- 6 It shows May 7 was the date it was deposited in the
- 7 account.
- 8 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Ms. Barnes, do you concur
- 9 with Mr. Simmons?
- 10 MS. BARNES: I do. Thank you.
- 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Do you have documentation of
- 12 the date of deposit?
- 13 MR. VOGT: Yes, I do.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Can you show that to us?
- 15 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Based upon the
- 16 testimony and explanation from Mr. Simmons, I move
- 17 that we waive the proposed fine.
- 18 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Second.
- 19 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion and a
- 20 second. I guess the only other option would be to
- 21 dismiss it because it does appear that there was
- 22 actually no violation. It was simply an error on
- 23 the campaign report. We have --
- 24 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: -- how it was filled
- 25 out, perhaps. I don't know.



- 1 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Well, we have a motion and a
- 2 second to waive the fine, and we can certainly do
- 3 that. Is there any further discussion?
- 4 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, yes, that's
- 5 a good point. I was going to ask, for purposes of
- 6 the record before the Commission. So if it's
- 7 waived, does it show -- if there's something that
- 8 happens in the future, does it show -- would it
- 9 reflect that there's a past violation if we waive
- 10 the fine? And if we dismissed it, would that mean
- 11 that there wasn't? That should be noted in the
- 12 record.
- 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: I would ask for legal
- 14 counsel -- or maybe that's a practical matter.
- 15 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I just wanted to
- 16 make sure.
- 17 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Does the Campaign Staff have
- 18 anything they --
- 19 MS. THOMPSON: I can't say --
- 20 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Well, let me do this.
- 21 I would tend to agree with that.
- 22 So this will now be the second motion I've
- 23 withdrawn. I'm messing up the whole process.
- 24 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, before you
- withdraw it, let me ask another question.



- 1 I may have misunderstood. I thought you said
- 2 that there was an amended report that has been
- 3 filed?
- 4 MR. VOGT: No. When I talked to Michelle, she
- 5 said to bring an amended form. So I did, and I have
- 6 it. It hasn't been filed. She told me just to
- 7 bring it with me.
- 8 So I did not file it yet because she told me to
- 9 bring it here.
- 10 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay.
- 11 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: He has indicated that
- 12 he's going to keep it open, so I don't want
- 13 another -- I don't want this to appear --
- 14 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Right.
- 15 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So I will withdraw,
- 16 for a second time, my pending motion, but leave it
- 17 to someone else to make the next --
- 18 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: I guess I would make a
- 19 motion that we dismiss the cause, because it does
- 20 not appear that there was a violation.
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: I'll second
- 22 that. Just make sure you file that before you leave
- 23 today.
- CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion to dismiss,
- 25 and a second. All in favor say aye.



- 1 THE COMMISSION: Aye.
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
- 3 (No response. Motion carried.)
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: The cause is dismissed.
- 5 Thank you.
- 6 MR. VOGT: Thank you.
- 7 *****
- 8 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Whoever is the closest one
- 9 to us, come forward.
- 10 MR. CLARK: Good afternoon.
- 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Good afternoon.
- MR. THARP: David Tharp, Howard County
- 13 Democratic Party. Cause No. 2014-6554-6. It's
- 14 actually dash-6 through dash-12.
- I apologize. D-A-V-I-D, T-H-A-R-P.
- MS. TAYLOR: It starts on page 2.
- 17 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Campaign Finance Staff has
- 18 the floor for presentation.
- 19 MS. THOMPSON: This is the Howard County
- 20 Democratic Party, Cause No. 2014-6554-6. And he's
- 21 got several as well.
- 22 Cause No. 2014-6554-7; Cause No. 2014-6554-8;
- 23 Cause No. 2014-6554-9; Cause No. 2014-6554-10; Cause
- 24 No. 2014-6554-11; Cause No. 2014-6554-12.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is that it?



- 1 MS. THOMPSON: Yes. These are all 1,000-dollar
- 2 proposed civil penalties. This committee has never
- 3 been before the Commission before.
- 4 And all the reports are filed?
- 5 MS. TAYLOR: Yes.
- 6 MS. THOMPSON: And all the reports are filed.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: So the fine would be \$6,000,
- 8 plus costs?
- 9 MS. TAYLOR: \$7,000.
- 10 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: \$7,000. You may proceed.
- 11 MR. THARP: Thanks for giving me the
- 12 opportunity.
- What this stems from, these are two -- the
- 14 Howard County Democratic party's 2011 and 2012
- 15 finance forms, as well as the file CFA3. All of
- 16 those reports were actually filed with the Howard
- 17 County Clerk's Office.
- 18 I was elected chairman last year. And as we
- 19 were preparing our '13 year report late last fall,
- 20 we noticed that we were actually filing with the
- 21 clerk's office, even though since we make very
- 22 modest contributions to local state rep campaigns,
- 23 we should have been filing with the Election
- 24 Division. So these reports were just actually filed
- 25 with the wrong agency.



- 1 As soon as we discovered that error late last
- 2 fall, I called Trent and Abbey at the Election
- 3 Division and said, you know, that my predecessor had
- 4 been filing these to the wrong agency, and what do
- 5 we do?
- 6 And the advice was, "Go back and resubmit
- 7 '11 and '12 and a statement of organization," which
- 8 we did.
- And then, once we got the letter about the
- 10 fines that were being imposed, we called again.
- 11 They said there would be a hearing, and to wait for
- 12 the hearing.
- And of course, as soon as we got the hearing
- 14 notice, we called and made sure what the process
- 15 was.
- We did self-report this error. We did actually
- 17 fulfill public transparency because these were
- 18 available to members of the public and to the media
- 19 and to the Howard County Clerk's Office. All of
- 20 these except for the 2012 year-end were actually
- 21 submitted on time.
- 22 The -- you know, we had tried to stay up with
- 23 the process in going forward, being in constant
- 24 contact with folks in the Election Division. These
- 25 were all committed under previous leadership, a



- 1 different chairman, a different treasurer, and, I
- 2 think perhaps more importantly, a completely
- 3 different process for handling campaign finance
- 4 reports. So we changed both leadership and our
- 5 SOPs.
- And then also, we are a volunteer organization.
- 7 And this fine is a very large fine and would cripple
- 8 our ability to fulfill our mission.
- 9 So based on all those facts, I would humbly
- 10 request that you waive the fines.
- 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anything else from the
- 12 staff?
- 13 (No response.)
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Questions from the
- 15 Commission?
- 16 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: So is it accurate
- 17 that there was one report that was late, the 2012
- 18 one?
- MS. TAYLOR: I believe that was late with the
- 20 county? Filed late with the county?
- MR. THARP: That's correct, yes. They're all
- 22 late to the Election Division, but --
- 23 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Right, exactly.
- 24 So that one was filed late to the county?
- MR. THARP: Correct, yes. And that was



- 1 actually due right before our party's
- 2 reorganization. So again, we have a different
- 3 treasurer. And as we were going through that
- 4 process, it was not filed.
- 5 So once we came to understand those facts late
- 6 last fall, we immediately started to compile those
- 7 reports and submit them to the right agency.
- 8 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay. And I think
- 9 this question is for staff, counsel, whoever.
- 10 So let's assume for purposes of argument that
- 11 all of these were filed with the Election Division,
- 12 and that they were all timely filed, with the
- 13 exception of the 2012 report. What would the
- 14 proposed fine be for the delinquent 2012 report?
- 15 Is that a thousand dollar fine?
- 16 MS. TAYLOR: I'm not sure how late it was filed
- 17 with the county.
- 18 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, okay.
- 19 That's right, because it's a per-day.
- 20 MS. TAYLOR: \$50 a day.
- 21 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Do you know how
- 22 late it was filed with the county?
- MR. THARP: It actually -- we discovered that
- 24 it hadn't been filed. So that was the only one that
- 25 was never filed with the county clerk's office.



- 1 So when we submitted that one to the Election
- 2 Division, that was the initial filing.
- MS. TAYLOR: So that was \$1,000.
- 4 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: So that's a
- 5 thousand dollars?
- 6 MS. TAYLOR: Yes.
- 7 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Okay.
- 8 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a motion?
- 9 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Mr. Chairman,
- 10 I would propose that we make a motion, and I'm going
- 11 to try and break this down into two pots.
- 12 The first pot would be for those that were
- 13 filed locally, but not filed in Indianapolis with
- 14 the Election Division, that we propose to waive
- 15 those fines.
- And then the remaining one that was not filed
- 17 at all, I would propose a 10 percent fine on the
- 18 penalty of a thousand dollars, plus the costs,
- 19 taking into account similar conditions that we've
- 20 heard in other cases today, that we have new
- 21 leadership in the committee, and that it's their
- 22 first time, and essentially they caught the error
- 23 themselves.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second to that
- 25 motion?



- 1 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Second.
- 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion and second. Any
- 3 further discussion?
- 4 (No response.)
- 5 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, all in favor
- 6 say aye.
- 7 THE COMMISSION: Aye.
- 8 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
- 9 (No response. Motion carried.)
- 10 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried. The fine
- 11 will be 10 percent of the one late filing, and
- 12 waived for the locally filed reports.
- 13 MR. THARP: Thank you very much.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you.
- 15 ****
- MR. RIMSANS: My name is Pete Rimsans. The
- 17 last name is spelled R-I-M-, as in Michael, S-A-N-S.
- 18 I'm here today representing Citizens for Better
- 19 Schools, and it is Cause No. 2014-5832-41.
- This is sort of a simple matter.
- 21 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Can you wait until -- first
- 22 we need the staff to give us a page number in our
- 23 books, and then they'll make the presentation to us,
- 24 and then you'll be following that.
- MR. RIMSANS: Okay.



- 1 MS. TAYLOR: It's on page 46.
- MS. THOMPSON: Mr. Chairman, this is Citizens
- 3 for Better Schools, Cause No. 2014-5832-41. This
- 4 committee has done a settlement agreement with us
- 5 in the past, and has a proposed civil penalty of
- 6 \$700.49.
- 7 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: What's the page
- 8 number?
- 9 MS. THOMPSON: I'm sorry. It's 47.
- 10 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: It starts on 46 and goes on
- 11 to 47.
- 12 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Love the
- 13 page breaks.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anything further from the
- 15 staff?
- 16 MS. THOMPSON: Pardon me?
- 17 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anything further?
- 18 MS. THOMPSON: No.
- 19 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Just for
- 20 point of clarification, were you sworn in earlier,
- 21 or did you arrive late?
- MR. RIMSANS: I arrived late.
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: We should
- 24 swear him in, I think.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Yes, you're absolutely



- 1 right.
- Dale, would you do that, please?
- 3 MR. SIMMONS: Please stand and raise your right
- 4 hand.
- 5 (At this time, the oath is administered.)
- 6 MR. SIMMONS: Thank you.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: You may proceed.
- 8 MR. RIMSANS: Essentially, Citizens for Better
- 9 Schools is a political action committee established
- 10 in 2008. It was primarily used in the 2008
- 11 elections.
- 12 There were a couple of transactions I think
- 13 that were conducted in 2009. But otherwise, this
- 14 PAC has been dormant. It has a zero balance in the
- 15 account. We've really honestly been debating about
- 16 whether or not we should close it out in its
- 17 entirety.
- But with regard to our 2013 filing, which was
- 19 due on January 13, we -- several days after that, on
- 20 the 20th, we received a letter informing us of our
- 21 error.
- We attempted to, then, on the 21st, file the
- 23 electronic reports, and we were locked out of the
- 24 system. And we were unable to -- we were able to --
- we made repeated phone calls on the 21st, 22nd,



- 1 24th, and 27th.
- 2 And finally, on the 28th, we were able to
- 3 establish contact with the Elections Division, and
- 4 at that time we were able to file a report.
- 5 So from the period of the 21st through the
- 6 28th, we were unable to file the report. And we
- 7 would ask that those fines be waived.
- 8 With regard to the time period of January 15th
- 9 through the 20th, we would just ask for leniency
- 10 since the PAC has no funds in it, and it hasn't for
- 11 some time.
- 12 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And why has it not been
- 13 closed?
- MR. RIMSANS: I think people just wanted to
- 15 keep it around in case we wanted to use it for
- 16 something in the past. And quite honestly, we're --
- 17 we're agreeable to closing it.
- 18 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any further -- any questions
- 19 by the commissioners?
- 20 (No response.)
- 21 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, any motions?
- 22 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I would move to
- 23 continue until closing.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second?
- 25 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Second.



- 1 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion and a second. Any
- 2 further discussion?
- 3 (No response.)
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, all in favor
- 5 say aye.
- 6 THE COMMISSION: Aye.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
- 8 (No response. Motion carried.)
- 9 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried. We will
- 10 continue this hearing until our next meeting, and
- 11 your committee should make a decision on closing
- 12 before that time.
- 13 MR. RIMSANS: All right. So I'm taking it,
- 14 without you saying that, that it would probably be
- in the best interest to close it before the next
- 16 meeting, or I'll assume that's the case.
- 17 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Very well.
- 18 MR. RIMSANS: Thank you.
- 19 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you.
- 20 ****
- MR. BECKER: Good afternoon. My name is Chris
- 22 Becker, C-H-R-I-S, B-E-C-K-E-R, Beth White for
- 23 Indiana. The administrative cause number is
- 24 2014-6526-13 through 16.
- MS. THOMPSON: That's on page 31 and 32.



- 1 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. We would ask for a
- 2 presentation from the staff.
- MS. THOMPSON: This is for a large supplemental
- 4 report. This is Beth White for Indiana, Cause No.
- 5 2014-6526-13; 2014-6526-14; 2014-6526-15; and
- 6 2014-6526-16.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And what are the total
- 8 fines?
- 9 MS. TAYLOR: The total is \$3,850, and the
- 10 mailing costs are \$52.
- 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. The floor is yours.
- 12 You may proceed.
- MR. BECKER: Thank you. These, I guess, four
- 14 constitute the first violations for the committee.
- 15 The staff and treasurer of -- these all stem from
- 16 2013 to 2014. The 10,000-dollar supplemental
- 17 contributions were filed with the annual report and
- 18 not with the supplemental reports that were due.
- 19 The staff and treasurer from 2013 are no longer
- 20 involved with the committee. The current staff and
- 21 treasurer have made sure the reports were filed.
- 22 The supplemental reports were filed, and additional
- 23 contributions that have come in have been -- have
- 24 been filed on time.
- We've also worked with the staff, the Election

- 1 Division, to make sure we were -- we have a full
- 2 understanding of the campaign finance compliance
- 3 laws, to make sure that we're compliant in the
- 4 future.
- 5 So we're just asking for leniency from the
- 6 Commission.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Anything further from the
- 8 staff?
- 9 MS. THOMPSON: No.
- 10 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Questions from the
- 11 Commission?
- 12 I'm assuming that the campaign intends to
- 13 remain open?
- MR. BECKER: Yes.
- 15 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: I want to
- 16 make sure I'm reading this correctly. I'm assuming
- 17 you changed your -- or you took care of the filings
- 18 or changed your staff in January?
- 19 MR. BECKER: Correct.
- 20 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: So in
- 21 essence, you self-reported by catching this, or did
- 22 you get a notice?
- MR. BECKER: I believe we were notified by
- 24 staff from the Election Division. It was sort of
- 25 the -- at the same time that we -- you know, the new



- 1 treasurer and staff became -- realized that these
- 2 can't -- that these reports weren't filed, and then
- 3 received official notice from the Election Division,
- 4 and then made the filings.
- 5 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: What was the reason for the
- 6 change in staff and the treasurer?
- 7 MR. BECKER: To be honest with you, I'm not
- 8 sure. I started with the campaign in February,
- 9 so ...
- 10 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Do you know if it had
- 11 anything to do with these violations?
- MR. BECKER: It's possible, but I don't know,
- 13 other than the committee decided to make a change
- 14 with the treasurer and with the staff.
- 15 I guess the only thing I would add is that
- 16 we've also changed how our =- our internal
- 17 protocols, and how we're handling campaign finance
- 18 stuff to make sure that we're compliant in the
- 19 future, and that the other contributions are -- make
- 20 sure that we follow the protocols that ...
- 21 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Make sure what?
- MR. BECKER: So we've also -- you know, we have
- 23 built-in protocols in the campaign to make sure that
- 24 we've -- that the treasurer is aware of the funds
- 25 that are coming in as they come in. And we have a



- 1 redundancy to make sure that any receipts that come
- 2 in are duly reported, as they're supposed to be.
- 3 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any other questions from the
- 4 Commission?
- 5 (No response.)
- 6 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any motions to be made by
- 7 the Commission? Hearing no motions --
- 8 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, I guess what
- 9 I'm trying to recall is what -- I thought we had a
- 10 -- I'm trying to be consistent. I think we've had
- 11 some earlier cases today that were similar, but I
- 12 can't remember what action we took in terms of that.
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: With regards
- 14 to the excesses, it looks like this may be
- 15 different, maybe. But we waived WellPoint, and we
- 16 settled the other.
- 17 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: And I'm wondering
- 18 about candidate committees that were -- may have
- 19 been -- that had delinquent filings, for starters.
- 20 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: That had what? I didn't
- 21 hear what you said.
- 22 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Delinquent
- 23 filings.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: WellPoint was
- 25 self-reporting.

- 1 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Right. So
- 2 candidate committees that ...
- 3 What did we do with Mr. Green?
- 4 MS. BARNES: Mr. Chairman and Commissioner
- 5 Overholt, on page 70 of your binder, there was a
- 6 similar one, if you want to consider it, Candidate
- 7 Tad Whitis for State Senate who had a large
- 8 contribution report that was filed late.
- 9 Do you want to know what the Commission did?
- 10 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Oh, I found it in
- 11 my notes. Am I right that we did 25 percent, plus
- 12 costs?
- MS. BARNES: Plus mailing costs. And it was
- 14 his first time. I don't know if that's similar.
- MS. TAYLOR: He accepted the deal at the
- 16 beginning.
- 17 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Yeah. He
- 18 accepted the deal. Let's be clear about that.
- 19 MS. BARNES: Okay. I think that's the only
- 20 other large ...
- MR. DECKARD: That's the only one similar that
- 22 I'm seeing.
- MS. BARNES: We had other reports that are
- 24 late.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a motion?



1	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: We have an ongoing
2	committee, ongoing campaign. We have repeated
3	failures to comply with the statute. I see a
4	difference between WellPoint in that there was no
5	self-reporting.
6	I'll make a motion that the fines be 10 percent
7	of the total \$3,850, plus costs.
8	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second?
9	VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Second.
10	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion and second.
11	Any further discussion?
12	(No response.)
13	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All in favor say aye.
14	THE COMMISSION: Aye.
15	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
16	(No response. Motion carried.)
17	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried. The fine
18	will be 10 percent of the \$3,850, plus costs.
19	MR. BECKER: Thank you very much.
20	****
21	MR. INGRAM: I'm Brent Ingram with the
22	Republican Central Committee for Miami County. I'm
23	here about the late filing for reporting period of
24	1/1/2013 through 12/31/2013.
25	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Can you spell your name,

- 1 please?
- 2 MR. INGRAM: Brent, B-R-E-N-T; Ingram,
- 3 I-N-G-R-A-M.
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Do you have a cause number?
- 5 MR. INGRAM: I failed to bring that with me.
- 6 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. Give us a minute and
- 7 we'll look it up.
- 8 MS. THOMPSON: It's on page 70. This is the
- 9 Miami County Republican Central Committee,
- 10 Cause No. 2014-6494-84. This committee has never
- 11 been before our commission before and has a penalty
- 12 of \$250.49.
- 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. Proceed.
- MR. INGRAM: I took over as treasurer in 2013,
- 15 and this was my first filing. I talked with the
- 16 outgoing treasurer, and he told me to file this at
- 17 the courthouse. I talked to voter registration, and
- 18 they told me to file it at the courthouse. I talked
- 19 to our new president, or new chairman. Told me to
- 20 file it at the courthouse.
- This is a case that was my mistake. It was a

- 7 really know what to do.
- 8 I mean either it would be to continue to give
- 9 him another opportunity to appear so we can kind of
- 10 ask when he put it in the mail -- but I guess we
- 11 have that.
- Or we can just waive the fine, because it seems
- 13 to me he was -- go ahead.
- 14 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Can I just make a
- 15 general comment? I don't know what the past
- 16 practice has been. I kind of have a problem with
- 17 making decisions on these letters that people just
- 18 submit in lieu of showing up.
- 19 I say that because this is -- I mean we would
- 20 probably have granted that, even saying this,
- 21 because of the circumstances.
- But, you know, guessing what these letters say,
- 23 what they mean, they could have shown up like
- 24 everybody else did.
- So I really don't enjoy reading these letters



- 1 and trying to make decisions. My preference would
- 2 have been to deny most if not all of them.
- 3 But that's just commentary about what I'm
- 4 thinking when reading these letters and trying to
- 5 figure out the intent of the writer.
- 6 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: It seems to me the most you
- 7 could possibly get out of the letter would be a
- 8 continuance. I would not want to start granting
- 9 waivers on the basis of letters.
- And the Commission has to have some teeth, has
- 11 to have some respect. And if people aren't willing
- 12 to show up and talk to us about it, they shouldn't
- 13 expect -- I mean ...
- 14 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: There's some
- 15 candidates that would have much rather submitted a
- 16 letter today --
- 17 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Several.
- 18 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: -- and had us just
- 19 decide on the letter than having to sit right
- 20 there and let us decide what to do.
- 21 So that's why I give these letters little
- 22 weight.
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Well, then,
- 24 since it sounds like they're something senseless,
- 25 let's make a motion to continue.

And if the staff will contact Mr. Spinks and 1 ask him to attend the next meeting? MS. THOMPSON: Okay. 3 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Or suffer the consequences. There's a motion. Ts there CHAIRMAN BENNETT: a second? 7 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: 8 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion and second. 9 further discussion? 10 (No response.) 11 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All in favor say aye. 12 THE COMMISSION: Aye. 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign. 14 (No response. Motion carried.) 15 I hate to Motion carried. CHAIRMAN BENNETT: 16 ask, but are there any other letters? 17 If not, let's talk about the -- is there --18 there's no one in this room present to testify on 19 any remaining campaign finance -- yeah. 20 I would ask if there's anyone else in the room 21 here today at this point in time to talk about 22 campaign finance violations. 23 (No response.) Seeing none, hearing none, CHAIRMAN BENNETT:

1	I would note that no one is present to testify on
2	any remaining campaign finance violations, and on
3	the hearings scheduled for today I'll declare the
4	hearings on all the remaining campaign finance
5	matters scheduled for today closed.
6	Is there a motion to impose the entire amount
7	of the proposed penalty, plus mailing costs, in all
8	remaining campaign finance enforcement actions?
9	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So move.
10	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion. Is there
11	a second?
12	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Second.
13	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a second. Any
14	discussion?
15	(No response.)
16	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, all in favor
17	say aye.
18	THE COMMISSION: Aye.
19	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
20	(No response. Motion carried.)
21	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried, and the
22	penalties will be adopted.
23	We can now talk about administrative
24	dissolutions. And I'll recognize the staff for
25	their recommendations regarding administrative

- 1 solutions on the committees.
- MS. THOMPSON: That's the purple tab.
- 3 Mr. Chairman, Members of the Commission, these are
- 4 committees that can be administratively dissolved.
- 5 They have not filed a report in three years and have
- 6 a balance of less than a thousand dollars. Both
- 7 chairman and treasurer of all these committees have
- 8 been notified.
- 9 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is anyone present here to
- 10 testify regarding these proposed administrative
- 11 dissolutions?
- 12 (No response.)
- 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Seeing or hearing no one --
- 14 that no one is present to testify in these matters,
- 15 I declare that the hearings on these administrative
- 16 dissolutions are closed.
- 17 Is there a motion to administratively dissolve
- 18 these committees in accordance with the information
- 19 presented by the Campaign Finance Staff?
- 20 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So moved.
- 21 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second?
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Second.
- 23 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion and a second. All in
- 24 favor of the motion say aye.
- THE COMMISSION: Aye.



- 1 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
- 2 (No response. Motion carried.)
- 3 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried. And the
- 4 motion to close the committees is granted. They're
- 5 administratively dissolved.
- 6 We will now talk about the campaign finance
- 7 complaints.
- 8 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Mr. Chairman,
- 9 we're hearing from our counsel on this end that
- 10 there are certain findings of fact we need to make
- 11 before we can administratively dissolve the
- 12 committees.
- MS. BARNES: The Campaign Staff pointed out
- 14 several findings of fact, Mr. Chairman.
- But the state statute 3-9-1-12, subsection
- 16 (e)(4), clause 4, says, "The Commission may issue an
- 17 order to administratively dissolve the committees if
- 18 they make the following finding: That there is no
- 19 evidence that the committees continue to receive
- 20 contributions, that the committee's no longer making
- 21 expenditures or otherwise functioning, and according
- 22 to the best evidence available, the dissolution will
- 23 not impair any contract or impede the collection of
- 24 a debt."
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Mr. Simmons, do you concur



- 1 with that?
- 2 MR. SIMMONS: Yes, I do, Mr. Chairman.
- 3 I would add that that would involve the
- 4 dissolution. The Commission could go on and waive
- 5 any outstanding fines.
- And the next subparagraph here finds that the,
- 7 "Use of public resources makes further efforts to
- 8 collect any outstanding civil penalty imposed
- 9 against the committee wasteful or unjust." That's
- 10 just an option. That doesn't -- it's not required
- 11 to dissolve the committee. It's just an option to
- 12 dissolve.
- And if you want to go the extra finding, you
- 14 can go ahead and waive the penalty.
- 15 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Are there existing
- 16 penalties pending?
- 17 MS. THOMPSON: Uh-huh.
- 18 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: And collection
- 19 efforts have been --
- MS. THOMPSON: They've been turned over to the
- 21 attorney general for collection.
- 22 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: How long ago?
- MS. TAYLOR: Last fall, maybe?
- MS. THOMPSON: Yeah, probably. Probably last
- 25 fall is the last candidate one we did.



- 1 Most of the ones I'm turning over today, after
- 2 today, Hoosier Heartland is on the list because
- 3 they're a political action committee.
- 4 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Do you believe the
- 5 efforts of collection is --
- 6 MS. THOMPSON: For -- for us? No. We've been
- 7 doing it for three years, and they haven't filed a
- 8 report. We've been fining the fines and sending the
- 9 notices, and we get nothing in return.
- 10 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: In your work to do
- 11 these dissolutions or administrative dissolutions,
- 12 is there any evidence that any of the committees
- 13 listed on this sheet continue to receive
- 14 contributions, make expenditures, or otherwise
- 15 function as a committee?
- 16 MS. TAYLOR: No. I mean they all have a
- 17 balance of less than a thousand dollars, so they
- 18 weren't big campaigns to begin with.
- 19 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: And the best evidence
- 20 we have available to the Commission and the staff,
- 21 the dissolution of the committee will not impair any
- 22 contract or impede the collection of a debt or
- 23 judgment of any person?
- MS. TAYLOR: Huh-uh.
- 25 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Based on just the



- 1 evidence we have?
- MS. TAYLOR: Correct.
- 3 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: I make a motion that
- 4 we administratively dissolve the committees listed
- 5 on the sheet you've provided.
- And also, based upon what you've told us, the
- 7 prudent use of the public resources makes further
- 8 efforts of collecting outstanding penalties of the
- 9 committees wasteful and unjust.
- 10 So I'd move that we waive any outstanding civil
- 11 penalties previously imposed by the Commission
- 12 against these committees.
- 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second to the
- 14 motion?
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: I'll second
- 16 for purposes of discussion.
- 17 I'm curious, if they've been turned over to the
- 18 attorney general, why we would bother. They
- 19 obviously -- the committees failed -- you know, we
- 20 previously are making judgment calls not to have
- 21 leniency on other bodies because they haven't
- 22 appeared. They haven't given us the respect of the
- 23 way of law, and whatnot. Why would we choose to be
- lenient on these and waive those fines? I wanted to
- 25 hear your logic.



1	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: My logic was that
2	somebody at the attorney general's office is going
3	to have to spend their time and resources chasing
4	these down. And it appears those efforts will
5	produce no results in terms of a payment of the
6	penalties. It's been maybe three years now?
7	MS. THOMPSON: Yes.
8	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: And I just feel like
9	we can lighten the load and not spin wheels and
10	spend resources that do not produce any results.
11	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, something
12	for clarification. Did you say that all of the
13	penalties have been turned over to the attorney
14	general's office for these, or are there some fines
15	that haven't been turned over yet for these
16	entities?
17	MS. THOMPSON: The ones you imposed today have
18	not been turned over to the attorney general.
19	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Right. Because
20	maybe, as a because I don't I don't know if I
21	want to tread on whatever might already be going on
22	in the attorney general's office.
23	But I would say I guess my suggestion might
24	be to say that the fines that haven't yet been
25	turned over to the attorney general's office don't

- 1 get turned over perhaps? Because who knows what
- 2 they've got going on over there. For all we know,
- 3 they could be on the cusp of entering a settlement
- 4 agreement.
- 5 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: With some of these on
- 6 the sheet?
- 7 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Yeah, yeah.
- 8 VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Is that an
- 9 acceptable compromise?
- 10 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Yeah. I mean my
- 11 understanding was that these were old and cold, and
- 12 nothing's been --
- 13 MS. TAYLOR: Right.
- 14 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: But maybe I was
- 15 mistaken in that assumption.
- 16 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I think we just
- 17 added to their bill today, right? Is that what we
- 18 did? I mean we've added to the total fines pending
- 19 against these folks today, right?
- 20 MS. TAYLOR: Right.
- 21 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: So I'm thinking
- 22 let's cut it off so they don't incur any more. We
- 23 close on them, and they don't incur any more in
- 24 front of us. But then it doesn't necessarily --
- 25 because the attorney general's office can decide how



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	1	to resolve that. I mean that's beyond our purview
	2	at this point.
	3	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Well, I can
	4	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Do you want to amend
	5	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: motion to just
	6	provide for administrative dissolution, and withdraw
	7	the portion of the motion to waive the existing
	8	fines and penalties.
	9	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: So I just want to
1	LO	understand. The motion would be to administratively
=	11	dissolve these committees that are listed in our
=	12	booklet, but not waive any of the fines?
	13	COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Correct.
	14	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a second?
	15	COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Sure, I'll second
	16	that.
	17	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion and a
	18	second. Any further discussion?
	19	(No response.)
	20	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All in favor say aye.
	21	THE COMMISSION: Aye.
	22	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
	23	(No response. Motion carried.)
	24	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried.
	25	It is my understanding that the Commission has

- 1 received several complaints which may allege
- violations of certain campaign finance requirements.
- 3 I would ask Mr. Deckard and Mr. King to inform us
- 4 about the status of these complaints, beginning with
- 5 the first set of documents in our binders.
- 6 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 7 Commission, behind the tab labeled Carmichael is a
- 8 complaint filed on August 4 by Indiana Beverage
- 9 Alliance concerning Monarch Beverage Company, Inc.
- 10 and Vision Concepts, LLC.
- The co-directors gave notice to those entities,
- 12 furnished a copy of the complaint, and on August 15,
- 13 received a response from Mr. Brian J. Paul of Ice
- 14 Miller regarding Monarch Beverage, who indicated
- that Monarch would be responding in due course.
- 16 Nothing further to report on that.
- 17 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you. Mr. Deckard, is
- 18 there anything further to report on?
- 19 MR. DECKARD: No, Mr. Chairman, just that we
- 20 are waiting to hear the response back from -- after
- 21 now having received the appearance.
- 22 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you. Which one is
- 23 next?
- MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 25 Commissions, the second complaint is behind the tab



- 1 designated Kolbe, K-O-L-B-E.
- 2 The Election Division received a complaint on
- 3 August 18 from Mr. Kolbe concerning Curt Nisly,
- 4 N-I-S-L-Y, Candidate for Indiana State
- 5 Representative District 22, and Ms. Wendy Hudson,
- 6 the Elkhart County Clerk.
- 7 At this point I have asked my counsel to review
- 8 the complaint, and that -- as the email indicates
- 9 that I included with the filing, Mr. Deckard has
- 10 indicated that his counsel may be reviewing this as
- 11 well.
- 12 MR. DECKARD: That's right.
- 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Mr. Deckard, do you concur
- 14 with that report?
- 15 MR. DECKARD: I do, Mr. Chairman. And I would
- 16 yield to my counsel, but she had to step out for a
- 17 moment to use some facilities that we have here.
- 18 But yes, I know she's done analysis of this
- 19 report per my direction.
- VICE CHAIRMAN PRO TEMPORE DICKEY: Do we want
- 21 to wait and move on to the next one, and come back
- 22 to that when she's back in the room?
- MR. DECKARD: If that's the will of the
- 24 Commission, certainly.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Well, while Ms. Barnes is



- 1 out, let's move to the next one.
- 2 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 3 Commission, the tab designated Heitzman,
- $_{
 m 4}$ H-E-I-T-Z-M-A-N, is a referral from the Hamilton
- 5 County Election Board regarding a matter that was
- 6 presented to that body and dismissed.
- 7 There is a lengthy series of emails that focus
- 8 around the Royal Tiger Political Action Committee.
- 9 There is, in addition to several emails from
- 10 Mr. Maurice Heitzman, a response to Mr. Deckard and
- 11 myself. And we forwarded Royal Tiger PAC a copy of
- 12 this complaint. It's the last item behind this tab
- 13 from Mr. Andrew Greider. And it sets forth the
- 14 responses made on behalf of Royal Tiger PAC at this
- 15 time.
- 16 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Mr. Deckard, is there
- 17 anything you'd like to add further?
- MR. DECKARD: No, Mr. Chairman, only to say
- 19 that we have now received, obviously, as Mr. King
- 20 was saying, a response back. The information is
- 21 there for the Commission to review.
- 22 And if you have any further instruction upon
- 23 division staff with more information related to the
- 24 Heitzman complaint, we would certainly follow the
- 25 direction of the Commission.



- 1 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. Ms. Barnes, while you
- 2 were out of the room, we discussed the Kolbe matter.
- 3 Do you have anything to add to our discussion on
- 4 that?
- 5 MS. BARNES: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I'm
- 6 sorry I had to step out.
- We oftentimes receive letters, or we encourage
- 8 individuals to submit a complaint in writing. And
- 9 oftentimes it will be a compilation of facts in
- 10 which we have to decipher are there any -- you know,
- 11 taking those facts at their face value, are there
- 12 any allegations of a Title III violation.
- 13 From the letter from Mr. Kolbe, I tried to
- 14 break it down into maybe eight different
- 15 allegations. And two of them perhaps touch on
- 16 Title III.
- 17 If the Commission would want to consider, the
- 18 General Assembly in 2013 adopted a statute, a new
- 19 criminal statute 3-14-1-17, which prohibits
- 20 government property from being used to distribute
- 21 campaign material. And that would -- and I'm not
- 22 making a judgment on whether or not the facts
- 23 alleged are true or whether that statute has been
- 24 violated. But that statute is there for you to
- 25 consider.



1	Under 364.2, the Commission can refer this
2	matter to an investigation and a full fact-finding
3	hearing.
4	The other issue that seemed to touch on
5	Title III was a campaign finance issue, whether or
6	not an entry in Mr. Nisly's campaign finance report
7	was accurate. Mr. Nisly's campaign finance report
8	reports an expenditure to one entity who designed
9	his website.
10	And Mr. Kolbe makes an allegation and seems to
11	submit documents for your review that maybe somebody
12	else designed the website. And so a question. Is
13	the campaign finance report accurate?
14	All of the other types of factual allegations
15	seem to involve ethical complaints which should be
16	handled by the local level. And upon the
17	Commission's direction, we could refer Mr. Kolbe
18	you know, maybe that's where he should take those
19	matters.
20	There were some allegations about a candidate's
21	wife serving on the County Election Board, but
22	there's no prohibition in Title III of a spouse
23	serving on a candidate's a candidate's spouse
24	serving on the election board.
25	There was an allegation with no semblance of

- 1 any proof, so I hesitate to even mention that. This
- 2 was a difficult one to discern. But there do seem
- 3 to be perhaps those two issues, if you wanted to
- 4 look further into them.
- 5 At this point the Commission has the ability
- 6 to -- I'm not sure if you discussed it. The
- 7 Commission has the ability to vote under 364.2
- 8 whether to refer this to an investigation and a
- 9 fact-finding hearing where all the parties would be
- 10 given notice and due process. Everyone would have
- 11 an ability to come and testify and put on evidence.
- 12 So today is -- you know, no factual judgments
- 13 are being made at this point. But I'm happy to
- 14 answer any questions, if you have them.
- 15 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Mr. Simmons, do you have any
- 16 thoughts about this?
- 17 MR. SIMMONS: Well, I just -- I identified the
- 18 two issues that come within Title III, of course.
- 19 One of the things I try to boil it down to is --
- 20 when I look at something, is what, well, would the
- 21 Commission have jurisdiction over? And it would be
- 22 something in Title III, as Leslie mentioned.
- 23 Certainly the 3-14-1-17, which is a new
- 24 statute, did come to mind.
- 25 However, looking at what's presented, what I



- 1 see on the government's website is a C-Tech link.
- 2 Now, there's some allegation, yes. But if you go
- 3 from C-Tech and you hit that and you go to a
- 4 company, and then you can go to some campaign stuff,
- 5 and I'll tell you what. You can go from the
- 6 Election Division's website to -- directly to the
- 7 Democratic Party with electioneering stuff on it, or
- 8 the Republican party.
- 9 So I -- I -- that would apply to an employee
- 10 too. I don't know if that clarification was made by
- 11 an employee. I looked at who would be the employee
- 12 in that particular case. I suppose Wendy Hudson
- 13 might be an employee, but I'm not sure because she's
- 14 an office holder. I'm not sure if office holders
- 15 are considered employees under that statute.
- 16 So, you know, trying to look at those
- 17 critically, I just came up with those issues.
- Now, I also did, as Leslie mentioned, see a --
- 19 at least a question posed as to whether the
- 20 committee accurately reported an expenditure with
- 21 respect to design of its website. So there is that
- 22 allegation in there. So those two things certainly
- 23 would be under Title III.
- What I don't see -- and I don't -- I'm not sure
- 25 I was privy to all communications here. What I



- 1 don't see is whether this was forwarded to either
- 2 Ms. Hudson or Mr. Nisly to at least initially get
- 3 their side of what those complaints might be. I
- 4 think that practice was followed, I think, in the
- 5 Carmichael, and complaints that we have the benefit
- 6 of a response. And that -- I think, as we've
- 7 already discussed, we had the response from the
- 8 complaint by Mr. Heitzman. So I don't see that.
- 9 But as Leslie mentioned, too, and I certainly
- 10 agree, that the Commission has, I think, a number of
- 11 things it can do, beginning with investigation or
- 12 looking into things or asking the division to look
- 13 further into things, up to and including holding
- 14 hearings under several sections.
- The one Leslie mentioned, I think, was
- 16 3-6-4.1-21, which kind of envisions a two-step phase
- 17 where you find a substantial reason to believe
- 18 election law violation has occurred. You can make
- 19 an investigation. And then, after that, you can
- 20 have a hearing and determine whether you think a
- 21 violation has occurred, and then take whatever
- 22 appropriate action after that.
- There's a hearing section in campaign finance
- 24 laws as well. So I think you have flexibility to do
- 25 sort of anything from formal -- to formal



- 1 investigation, including the power to subpoena, up
- 2 to and including a whole hearing on anything that's
- 3 led to Title III.
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Thank you. It sounds to me
- 5 like there's some factual development left to
- 6 perform, and then perhaps refine the legal analysis
- 7 to determine what, if anything, the Commission has
- 8 jurisdiction to hear.
- 9 Have the co-directors, as of today, notified
- 10 Mr. Nisly or Clerk Hudson regarding the filing of
- 11 complaints? Invited any responses?
- MR. KING: No, Mr. Chairman, I have not.
- MR. DECKARD: I would echo no, Mr. Chairman, I
- 14 have not. We've not notified either.
- 15 Based on the analysis that Ms. Barnes did on
- 16 the allegation of the Kolbe complaint, and based on
- 17 that she brought up the potential for a campaign
- 18 finance complaint, our thought was, given the --
- 19 what we've done in the other two cases with allowing
- 20 the finance -- the person who received the complaint
- 21 on the finance violation to respond, similar to
- these other two that we're looking at today.
- 23 So that would logically be the next step for
- 24 the finance portion of that complaint.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. Any thoughts by the



- 1 other commissioners? It seems to me that that would
- 2 be an appropriate step, get that information, invite
- 3 responses from each after they receive complaints,
- 4 and perhaps the co-directors could provide us a
- 5 report at the next meeting.
- 6 MR. KING: Sure.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Any other comments by the
- 8 Commission members about these matters?
- 9 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 10 Commission, the final tab before coming to Voting
- 11 Systems is titled Sheckels, S-H-E-C-K-E-L-S.
- 12 This is an email sent to Mr. Deckard and myself
- 13 which raises, primarily, the issue of the current
- 14 statute regarding what you might call impersonation
- 15 of an incumbent. The particular question is when
- 16 the Election Division receives, frequently, what I
- 17 might call magic words such as F-O-R, for, or elect,
- 18 that must be included on the campaign material to
- 19 avoid a candidate's impersonation of an incumbent.
- The email also raises a question about a lack
- 21 of a magnetic car sign.
- It does not, from my reading, actually allege a
- 23 violation. It's more in the nature, as I told
- 24 Mr. Deckard, of a request for an advisory opinion,
- 25 certainly with regard to impersonation of the



- 1 incumbent.
- Our staff would be willing to work with his
- 3 staff to develop an advisory opinion on the
- 4 essential elements of impersonating an incumbent so
- 5 that we can provide advice to candidates and parties
- 6 when we receive this question.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is that a fair summary from
- 8 your standpoint, Mr. Deckard?
- 9 MR. INGRAM: Yes, Mr. Chairman. I would add to
- 10 it that while the correspondence from the Sheckels,
- 11 Ms. Sheckels, does not come in the form directly of
- 12 a complaint, I think it does signal, as Mr. King was
- 13 saying, a larger cry for help that we are getting
- 14 around the state with various things such as yard
- 15 signs and correspondence, where clearly some free
- 16 speech issues -- and we can have greater analysis on
- 17 that -- free speech issues are getting into -- in
- 18 conflict with what maybe the code says about
- 19 implication of holding office.
- 20 Certainly candidates for office, as the
- 21 Commission knows well, will say a lot of different
- 22 things to get elected, not the least of which is the
- 23 title.
- 24 So I would be happy to join Mr. King and, of
- 25 course, our counsels, in submitting advisories that



- 1 the Commission would find agreeable and could
- 2 certainly move forward with.
- 3 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And would that advisory
- 4 opinion include a recommendation whether this is,
- 5 indeed, a complaint that needs to be treated as
- 6 such?
- 7 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 8 Commission, typically, an advisory opinion is meant
- 9 to address matters beyond the particular case at
- 10 hand. It's meant to be ongoing guidance. We print
- 11 advisory opinions in the back of our campaign
- 12 finance manual regardless of the specific case that
- 13 brought the issue.
- 14 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: So the advisory opinion,
- 15 then, would not answer the question as to whether
- 16 this is or is not truly a complaint?
- 17 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, what I would view the
- 18 advisory opinion as doing would be giving the
- 19 Commission the opportunity to give guidance to
- 20 inquirers about whether the absence of words like
- 21 "elect" or "for" on their face constitutes a
- 22 potential violation of 3-9-3-5. That's the question
- 23 that we've received.
- 24 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay, very well. Anything
- 25 further from the commission members, legal counsel?



1	(No response.)		
2	CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All right. Let's move on		
3	to VSTOP. At the Commission's August 15 meeting,		
4	we received preliminary information from VSTOP		
5	regarding new legislation requiring the Commission		
6	to adopt procedures for the post election auditing		
7	and the counties using direct record electronic		
8	voting systems or touch screen systems.		
9	MR. SCHEELE: Mr. Chairman, Commissioners, I'm		
10	Ray Scheele, S-C-H-E-E-L-E, with the VSTOP program.		
11	We have some guests here today that I'd just		
12	like to quickly introduce. Mr. Nick Sabato is our		
13	associate director of international development at		
14	Ball State University, and we would like him to		
15	introduce our guests and tell you a little bit about		
16	what they've witnessed or why they were here		
17	today to witness your commission. Nick?		

- MR. SABATO: Thank you, Ray. 18
- And I would like to thank the Commission, and 19
- also welcome my two guests here today. These two 20
- individuals are -- traveled all the way from Burma 21
- to be with us for a three-week period of time. This 22
- is Myat Thu and Lwin Ko Latt, and they are both 23
- directors and faculty members at the Yangon School 24
- of Political Science, in Yangon, Myanmar.



- 1 These individuals came to Washington, D.C. a
- 2 couple of weeks ago, where they took part in the
- 3 American Political Science Association Conference.
- 4 They're at Ball State for two weeks learning about
- 5 political science, as well as higher education
- 6 administration. And then they'll be returning to
- 7 Washington, D.C. prior to going home for a seminar
- 8 with the U.S. Institute of Peace.
- 9 So these two individuals are really making
- 10 remarkable strides in their home country as Burma
- 11 begins to open up in terms of democratic
- 12 transitions. They've been through trials and
- 13 tribulations literally in their home country, and
- 14 are here to see the democratic process at work.
- 15 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Welcome. We're glad to have
- 16 you here today. Thank you for being here.
- 17 MR. SCHEELE: Thank you, Nick.
- 18 MR. SABATO: Thank you.
- MR. LOSCO: My name is Joe Losco, L-O-S-C-O.
- 20 And at the last meeting, Mr. Chairman, as you
- 21 mentioned, we were asked to come up with audit
- 22 procedures for direct record electronic voting
- 23 systems for audits.
- I have plenty of copies, if you don't have
- 25 them. But I assume you do have copies of the draft



- 1 report we have.
- 2 This was put together with -- in consultation
- 3 with individuals from the U.S. Election Assistance
- 4 Commission. We also consulted clerks -- several
- 5 clerks in Indiana regarding their approach.
- 6 We've tried to put together best practices here
- 7 in these audit procedures, and we're here to answer
- 8 any questions you have.
- 9 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 10 Commission, Mr. Deckard and myself have extensively
- 11 reviewed the two-page proposed audit procedures that
- 12 you find in your binder, and would recommend them to
- 13 you for adoption. The law requiring these
- 14 procedures will be applicable to the November 2014
- 15 election, so there is some time importance in having
- 16 them finalized.
- We have questions regarding the worksheets, as
- 18 we'll call them, that follow the two pages, and
- 19 would recommend that the Commission defer action on
- 20 those worksheets to allow further review by us and
- 21 further input from counties.
- 22 I think Commissioner Klutz had specific
- 23 recommendations to refer to on that.
- 24 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: It was just the forms
- 25 you're referring to. So I talked with Beth Dlug.



- 1 MR. LOSCO: Yes.
- 2 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So have you talked to
- 3 her about her comments?
- 4 MR. LOSCO: Yes.
- 5 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Okay. So I don't
- 6 want to extend this any longer if you --
- 7 MR. LOSCO: Absolutely.
- 8 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: -- if you've
- 9 discussed with her --
- 10 MR. SCHEELE: We listened to Beth.
- 11 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So did I, so ...
- MR. LOSCO: As a matter of fact,
- 13 Mr. Commissioner, we asked Beth for some of the
- 14 forms she has. And some of the forms you have are
- 15 examples that are used in various counties right
- 16 now, including Beth's county, Allen County, and
- 17 Tippecanoe.
- 18 MR. SCHEELE: If I could just expand on that
- 19 for a moment, the forms are really just samples.
- 20 They aren't to be, in our estimation, dictated to
- 21 counties as the ones you have to use, because all
- 22 counties have different -- their own, I should say,
- 23 forms that they are very used to, that they are
- 24 comfortable with, to reconcile the votes on election
- 25 night.



- 1 But these, we thought, were some of the best
- 2 practices, and that's why we wanted to include
- 3 those.
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: I guess my question is, will
- 5 deferral of action with regard to the forms create
- 6 any issues with regard to the fall election?
- 7 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 8 Commission, no, I don't believe so. Mr. Deckard
- 9 and I are scheduled to speak at the Northern and
- 10 Southern District meetings of the Clerks Association
- 11 next week. And I had anticipated that we would talk
- 12 about the procedures and make examples of forms
- 13 available.
- 14 So I think the clerks will be adequately
- 15 prepared for the November 2014 elections upon the
- 16 adoption of procedures, even though forms may
- 17 continue to be polished.
- 18 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Do you agree with that,
- 19 Mr. Deckard?
- MR. DECKARD: Mr. Chairman, yes. What I would
- 21 add here is that we worked extensively with VSTOP
- 22 and staff, particularly around the first two pages,
- 23 and had a great deal of comfort there with the forms
- 24 or worksheets that follow that.
- 25 As I think VSTOP is saying, their counties have



- 1 come up with worksheets and practices and things to
- 2 respond to the needs that they have. We want to
- 3 make sure, from division side, that the terminology
- 4 we use and reference that is made on there reflects
- 5 words and code, and words that would legally
- 6 otherwise be binding.
- 7 So we're very comfortable with the first two,
- 8 and the first two pages are reflective of what we
- 9 can report now.
- 10 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Very good, thank you.
- 11 Anything further from VSTOP?
- 12 MR. LOSCO: No, Mr. Chairman.
- 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: With that, is there any
- 14 motion to approve the VSTOP audit procedures, or is
- 15 there any further discussion on that issue?
- 16 If there's no further discussion, is there a
- 17 motion --
- 18 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I'm sorry. I'd
- 19 just like to ask, so when you're -- so when you go
- 20 to the clerks' meetings, you'll be going over these
- 21 proposed forms for input.
- 22 But in terms of the procedure itself, I mean
- 23 has their input already been solicited in terms of
- 24 audit procedures?
- 25 MR. DECKARD: I think VSTOP has indicated



- 1 they've got some county input. I don't know if
- 2 they'd want to ...
- MR. LOSCO: Yes, we have. We have at least
- 4 three counties, Allen, Tippecanoe, and Elkhart --
- 5 MR. SCHEELE: Elkhart.
- 6 MR. LOSCO: -- were all --
- 7 MR. SCHEELE: In detail, they went through
- 8 this.
- 9 Others we talked to verbally about the way in
- 10 which they conducted their current audits, and
- 11 whether or not they would subscribe to a procedure,
- 12 and they said that they would welcome it, almost to
- 13 a person.
- 14 There were -- which is back to the point about
- 15 the forms. They all have their own forms or their
- own procedures on election night, and those forms
- 17 should be very helpful to them. But again, I don't
- 18 know whether or not they would welcome right away a
- 19 receipt mandating the forms to be used because,
- 20 indeed, we have different voting machines, and this
- 21 pertains only to DREs. So that's the counties that
- 22 we focused on.
- 23 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: These procedures,
- 24 though, that we're -- we're acting as to approve
- 25 these procedures today. And these procedures are

- 1 the ones that you have drafted in consultation with
- 2 various --
- 3 MR. LOSCO: Yes.
- 4 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: -- correct? Okay.
- 5 MR. SCHEELE: Correct.
- 6 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: And these will be effective
- 7 immediately?
- 8 MR. LOSCO: Presumably.
- 9 MR. SCHEELE: Presumably, if that's whatever
- 10 you decide.
- 11 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, so of the
- 12 92 counties, how many counties would this apply to
- in terms of their systems?
- MR. LOSCO: There are roughly 50 percent of the
- 15 counties that use a DRE from one particular vendor,
- 16 so at least that.
- MR. SCHEELE: 46 out of the 92, I think.
- 18 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: And you've talked
- 19 to three of the 46. And you said you talked
- 20 directly in detail to three. And how many others
- 21 have you -- of the other 43 counties, how many of
- 22 the others have you heard from or had communication
- 23 with?
- MR. LOSCO: There are -- those are the ones
- 25 that we relied on. Those are the ones who came



- 1 forward with procedures that they suggested that
- 2 would be useful.
- 3 MR. SCHEELE: Some counties -- for example,
- 4 here in Marion County, they do not use DREs. So
- 5 some of the larger counties we know also have very
- 6 fine procedures in place, do not use DRE. So we
- 7 were focused on those.
- 8 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: And the reason we're
- 9 doing this is because of the new statute --
- 10 MR. SCHEELE: Correct.
- 11 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: -- saying that you
- 12 must have a process or procedure in place?
- MR. SCHEELE: That's what the statute calls
- 14 for.
- 15 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So that's why we're
- 16 taking this action, kind of formalizing this.
- 17 MR. SCHEELE: Right.
- 18 MR. LOSCO: That's right.
- 19 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Is there a motion to approve
- 20 the VSTOP audit procedures?
- 21 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: So move.
- 22 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion. Is there
- 23 a second?
- 24 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Second.
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: We have a motion and a



- 1 second. Is there any further discussion from the
- 2 commissioners?
- 3 (No response.)
- 4 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Hearing none, all in favor
- 5 say aye.
- 6 THE COMMISSION: Aye.
- 7 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All opposed, same sign.
- 8 (No response. Motion carried.)
- 9 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Motion carried. Procedures
- 10 approved. Thank you.
- 11 MR. SCHEELE: Thank you.
- 12 MR. LOSCO: Thank you.
- 13 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: If we could talk for just a
- 14 moment about our next meeting date, and the ethics
- 15 CLE is coming up. The co-directors have scheduled
- 16 the annual Election Administrators Conference
- 17 December 16 and 17, at the JW Marriott in
- 18 Indianapolis.
- 19 If the Commission members would like to serve
- 20 as presenters in the panel on elections and ethics
- 21 which will be offered to the conference attendees
- 22 for CLE credit, the Election Division can submit the
- 23 application for CLE credit for approval.
- So we did this last -- we did this last year,
- 25 and I think it was pretty well received. It's a



- 1 nice thing for people attending to pick up some
- 2 credit, and it gives us some credit as
- 3 commissioners.
- 4 So I guess the question is whether we want to
- 5 participate in that. So that would be either one
- 6 of those dates, or do we know which date that would
- 7 be?
- 8 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, Members of the
- 9 Commission, we have previously scheduled the CLE for
- 10 immediately before the conference comes to order.
- 11 So it's 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. on December 16, which
- 12 is a Tuesday.
- 13 I will say we did have -- even at that early
- 14 hour, we did have about 15 to 20 attorneys who
- 15 attended the conference who were very glad to --
- 16 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I was happy --
- 17 MR. KING: -- in mid-December.
- 18 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: -- because that
- 19 was the end of my three-year cycle.
- 20 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: So that's a good thing. I
- 21 personally have a trial scheduled that day, but we
- 22 all know how that goes.
- 23 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I'm good for the
- 24 16th. I can help people be --
- 25 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: -- consensus.



160 MR. KING: Mr. Deckard and I will proceed to 1 submit the application, if that's ... 2 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: All right. That's it. 3 would entertain -- and we would also have a -- hold a meeting then? 5 MR. KING: Typically what we would do is, we 6 will bring campaign finance orders from today's 7 meetings, for example, but not anything that would 8 take more than a routine short action by the 9 Commission. 10 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Okay. So the Indiana 11 Election Commission is finished with business for 1.2 today. 13 Is there a motion to adjourn? 14 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Wait. 15 We didn't have a motion to affix the signatures. 16 MR. KING: We don't have any. 17 MS. BARNES: That was my suggestion. 18 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Sorry. 19 responding to whispers. I withdraw that comment. 20 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: So with that business taken 21 care of, is there a motion to adjourn? 22 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: So moved. 23 CHAIRMAN BENNETT: Second? 24 COMMISSION MEMBER KLUTZ: Second. 25
